#### The Night Gardener Jonathan Auxier

Irish orphans, Molly and Kip, travel to England to work as servants in a crumbling manor house where nothing is quite what it seems. Soon the siblings are confronted by a mysterious stranger and secrets of the cursed house.

#### El Deafo Cece Bell

Everyone thinks Benny Alvarez is Mr. Negativity. According to Benny, he's just realistic about seeing the "other side" of things—when it comes to just about everything. Eventually, Benny Alvarez will have to decide--is the glass half empty or half full?

#### **Eleanor & Park** Rainbow Rowell

Set over the course of one school year in 1986, this is the story of two star-crossed misfits--smart enough to know that first love almost never lasts, but brave and desperate enough to try.

# Weight of Water Sarah Crossan

As she and her mother move to a crumbling apartment, recent immigrant Kasienka has a difficult transition when girls at school tease her for being different and as well as for her broken English.

#### **Steelheart** Brandon Sanderson

At age eight, David watched as his father was killed by an Epic, a human with superhuman powers, and now, ten years later, he joins the Reckoners-- the only people who are trying to kill the Epics and end their tyranny.

# Other Recommendations

#### The Crossover Kwame Alexander

Josh and his twin brother Jordan are awesome on the court. But Josh has more than basketball in his blood; he's got mad beats, too, and tells his family's story in verse. This is a fast and furious novel of family and brotherhood.

# I Am Malala: How One Girl Stood Up for Education and Changed the World (Young Readers Edition) Malala Yousafzai & Patricia McCormick

Malala was taught to stand up for what she believed, and she fought for her right to be educated. She nearly lost her life for her cause, shot point-blank on the school bus. Malala survived and became an international symbol of peaceful protest and the youngest ever Nobel Peace Prize winner.

#### Hope: a School, a Team, a Dream Bill Reynolds

Hope High School was known for its state championship basketball teams in the 1960s, but its 2012 team is much different. Disobedient, distracted, and overwhelmed by family troubles, with mismatched sneakers and a penchant for profanity and anger, these boys represent Coach Dave Nyblom's dream of a championship, however unlikely that might seem.
