After working with the class, she achieved many small goals and larger goals of obtaining a driver's license and citizenship. We at LVKC were so proud.

Full of energy and ambition, Jessica then had a new goal of becoming a CNA. Jessica enjoys working with the elderly and making them feel more comfortable. She has also seen how the trials of aging can depress people and she enjoys talking with them and making them smile. She has made lasting friendships from the group class and we will miss her but we know she is leaving to make the world a better place and we are very proud!





IN MEMORIAM



DOROTHY (DOT) HOOK 1921-2016

Dorothy (Dot) Hook passed away on September 24, 2016 at the age of 95. She was a founding member and the first treasurer of Literacy Volunteers of Coventry (LVC), the first Literacy Volunteers of America affiliate in Rhode Island. She served on the Board of Directors, was Chair of the Tutor Advisor Program which she developed, and the recipient of the *2000 UNSUNG HERO AWARD*. Dorothy and her husband of 71 years Richard Bradford Hook resided in Coventry, RI for 41 years. Richard died in 2013. She is survived by her daughter Pamela, son John, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Following her husband's death, Dorothy moved to Goshen, New York to be closer to family. LVKC Secretary and original Board Member Sandy Dupree remembers Dot "as always pleasant and willing to undertake whatever the Board needed from her. She was always very friendly to everyone and Dot always had a great, dry sense of humor! A great asset to the organization, she stayed on the Board for a long time." Dorothy dedicated 24 years to serving on the LVKC Board.

Principles of Adult Learning & Working With Adult Literacy Learners

Prior to taking the Tutor Training Workshop (TTW), prospective tutors must take 2 required classes on line at www.proliteracyednet.org/. These free classes are Principles of Adult Learning and Working with Adult Literacy Learners. Prospective tutors will be provided with certifications upon completion of the classes which they will then submit with their registration to the TTW. Tutor training is then conducted in a series of workshops totaling 15 hours in a classroom setting. Midway through training, volunteers are matched with students so that they may experience the tutoring process and receive guidance as needed. At the conclusion of training, tutors are certified.
