FOREWORD

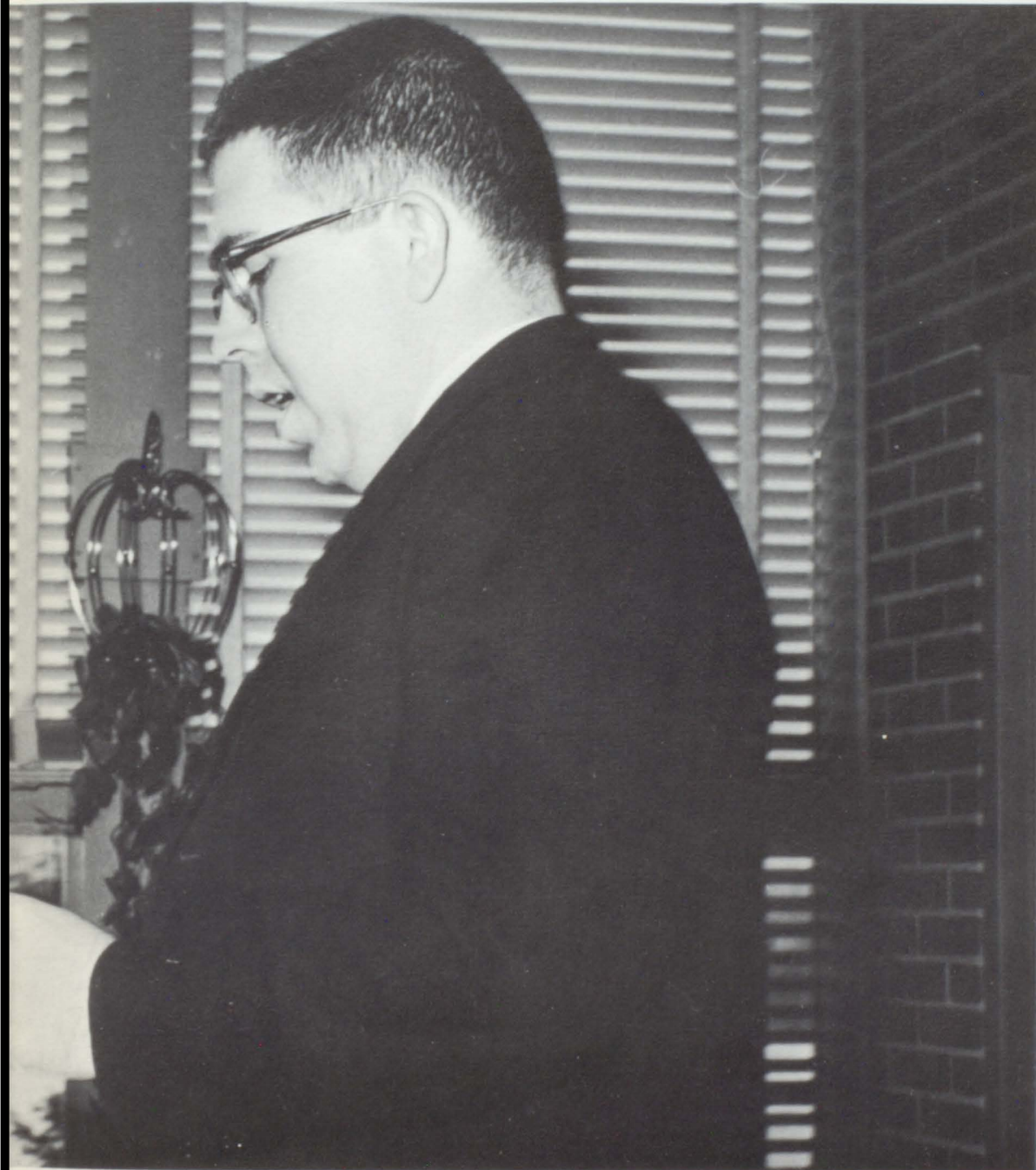

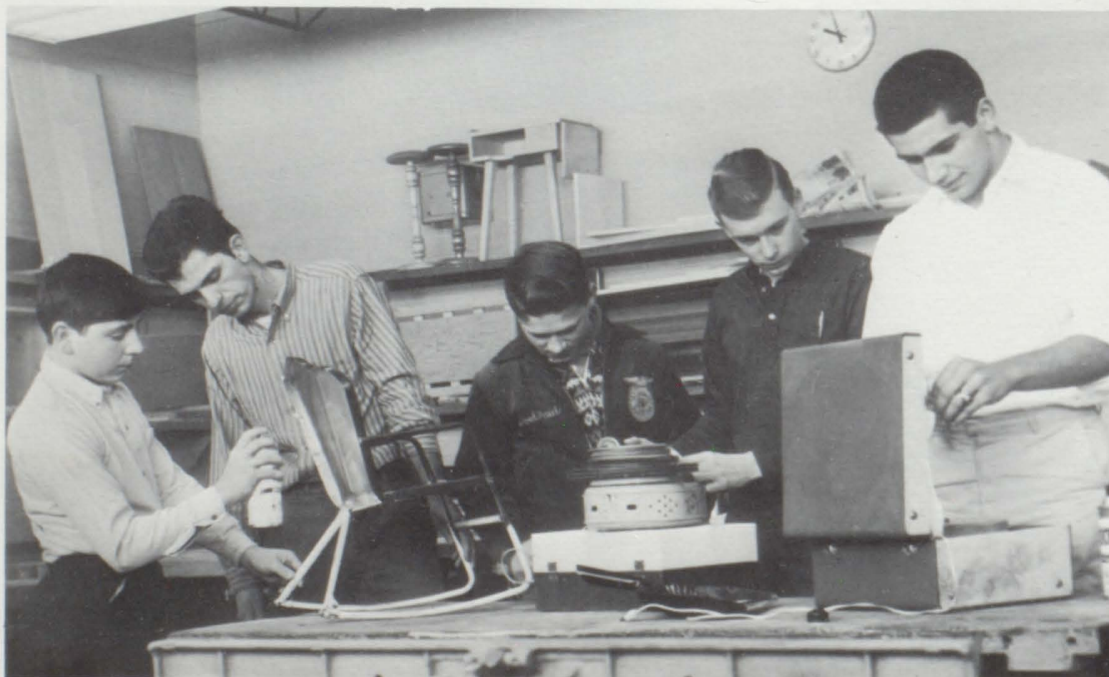
