



FOREWORD



Within the covers of this book, *The Knotty Oak*, we have recorded the various aspects of our high school years. We hope that in future years it will help us recall these memorable days.



As the work for the yearbook got underway, the *Knotty Oak* staff found themselves faced with the great task of summarizing our complete high school life.







As the evening drew to an end we had stored within us the memories of one of the happiest occasions of our lives.




