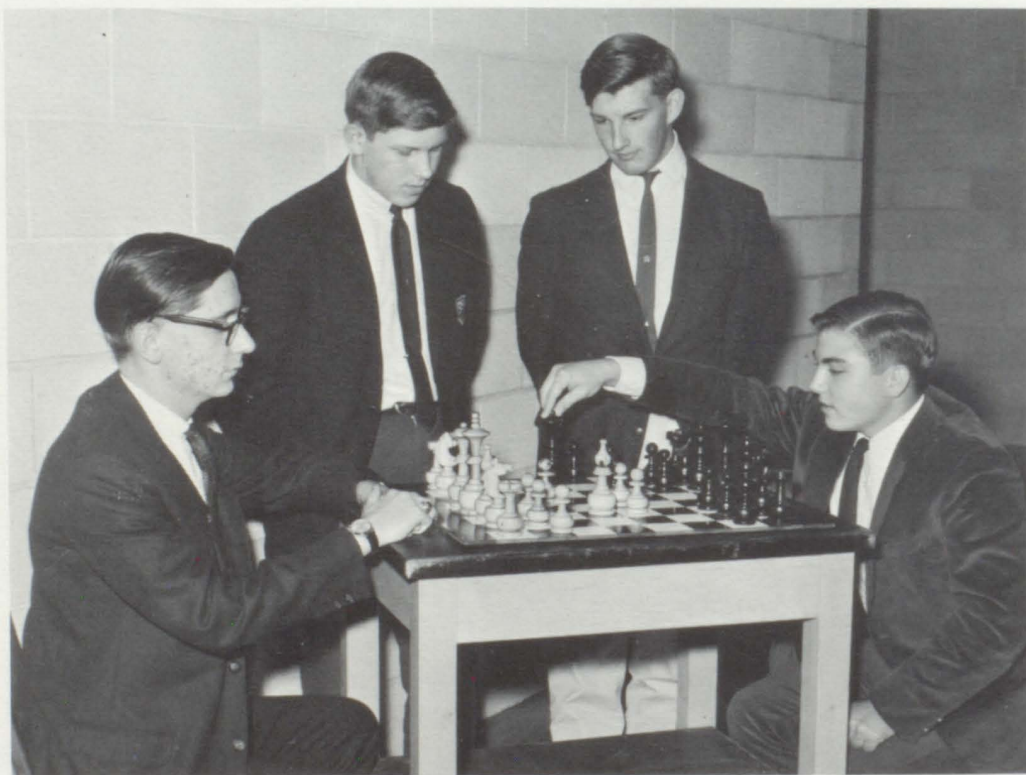

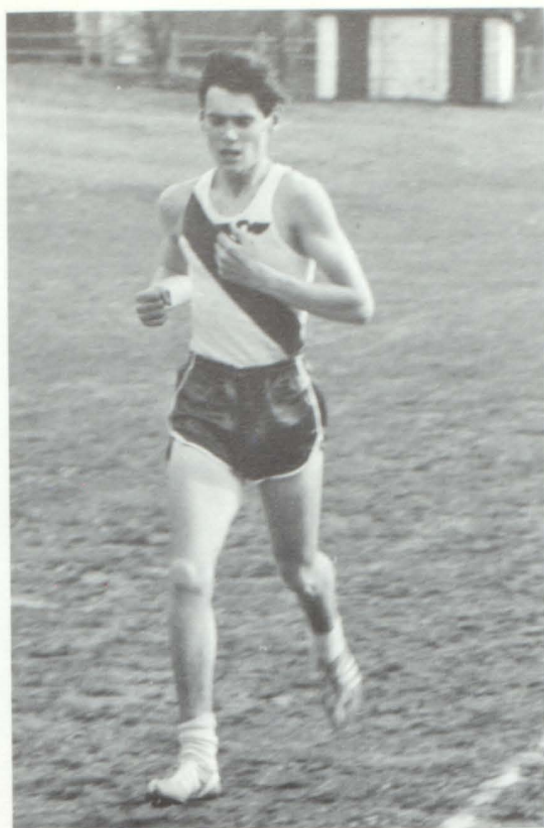

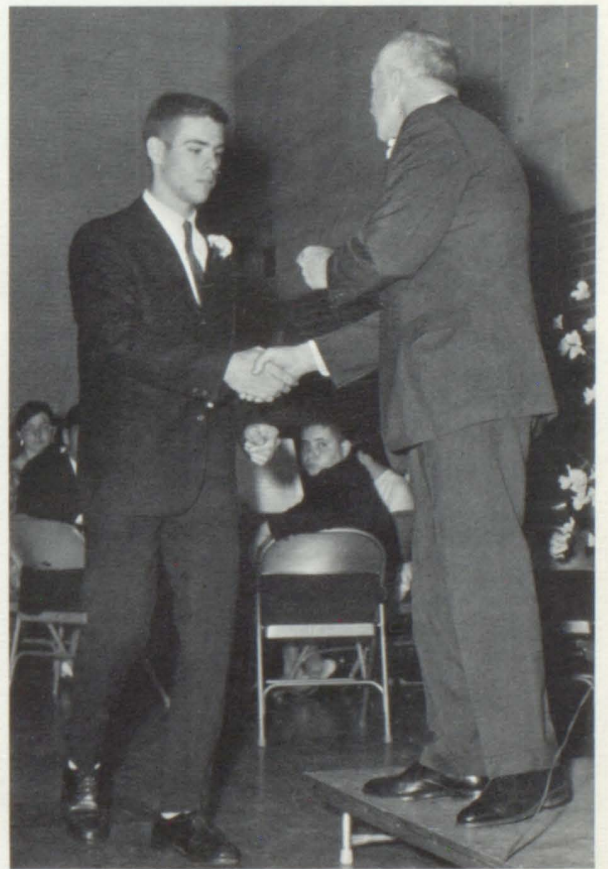

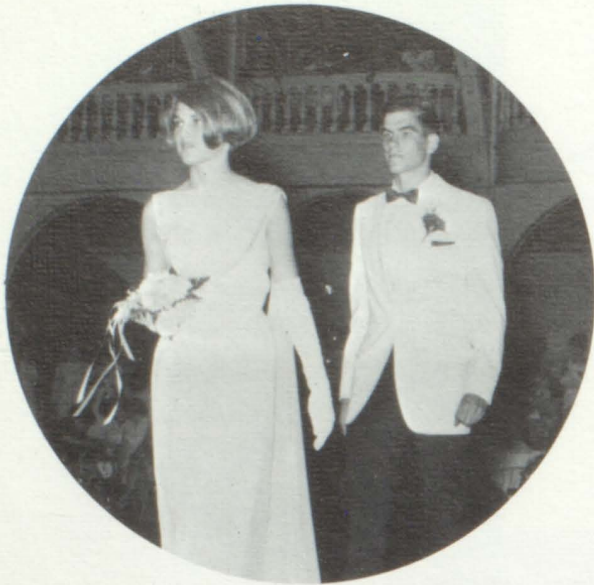

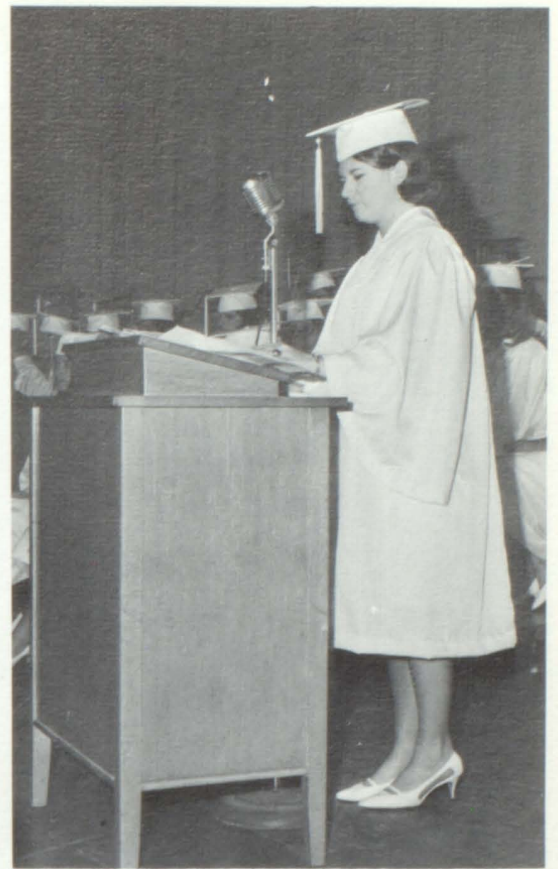

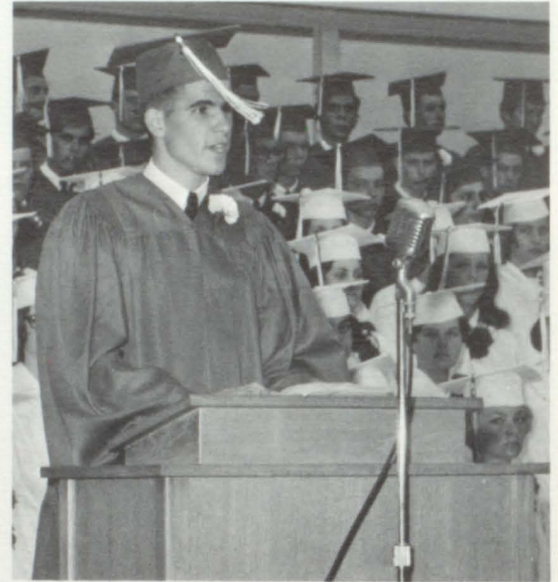
GRADUATION

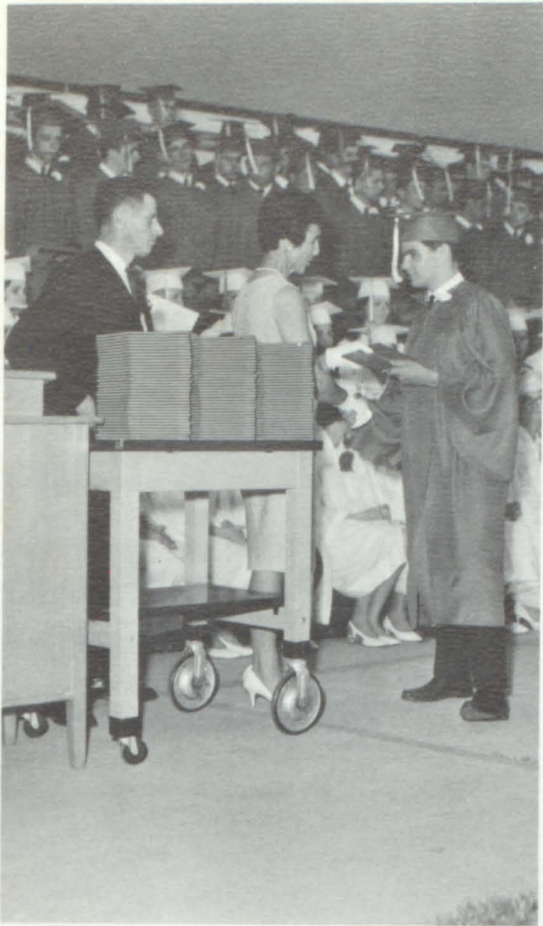

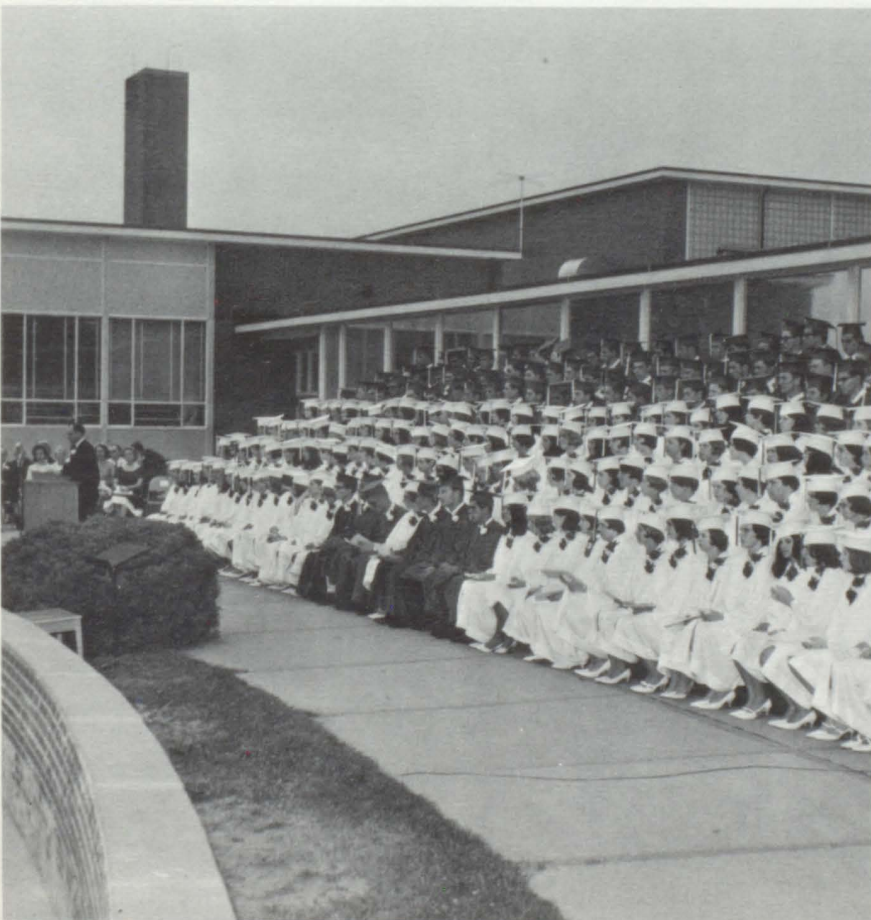

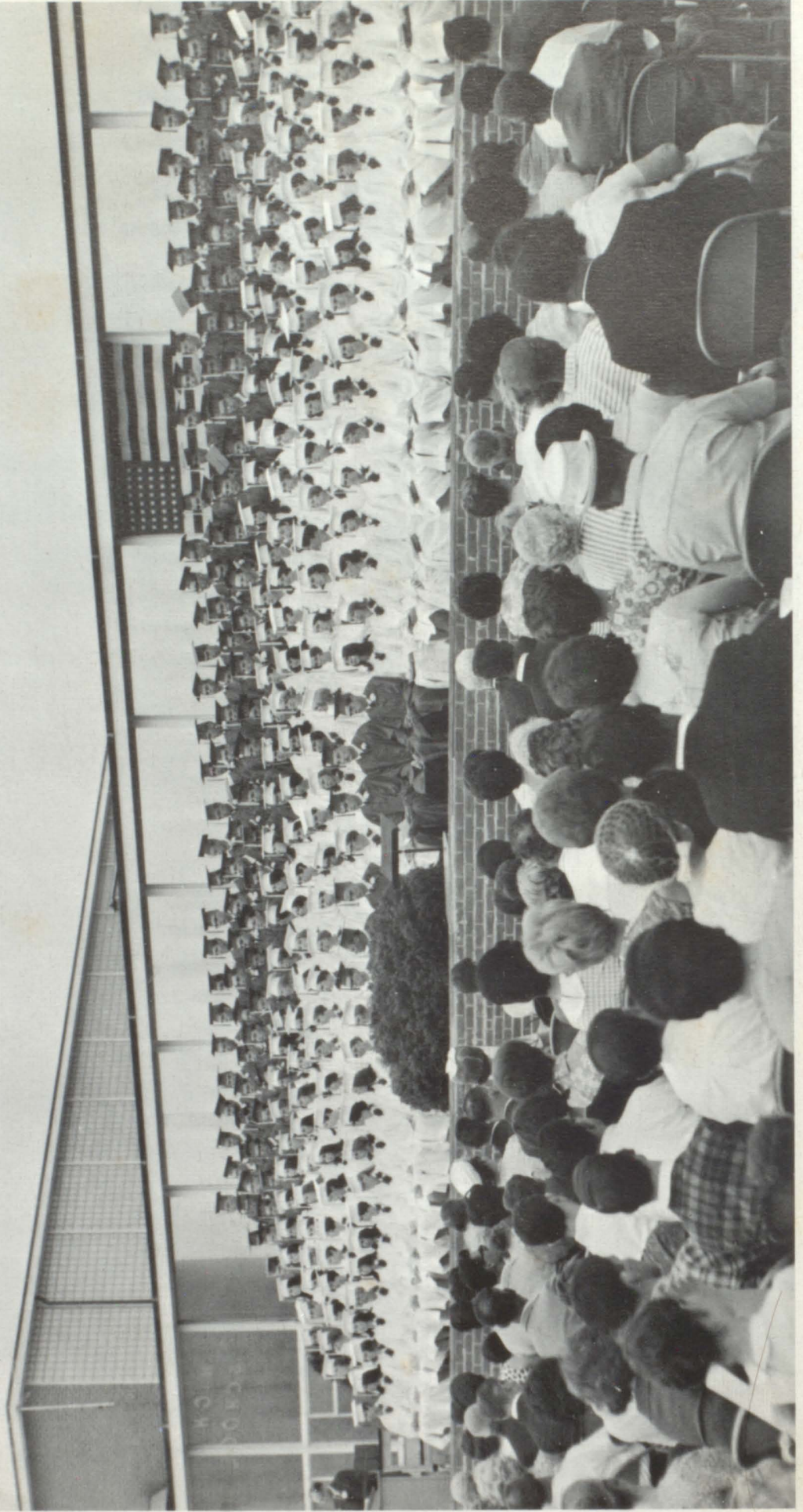
