Class History

1966

As the Christmas season approached, we focused our attention on the staging of our Senior Play, a courtroom drama entitled You the Jury.


Soon a day we had all anticipated, the day of our Senior Ball arrived. Reflections of our past four years filled our minds as we danced and participated in the Grand March.
