We hope you will look back in fondness on your high school days and in appreciation for what the Coventry High School faculty and community have attempted to offer you in quality educational programs.




"Oaker Matmen Have An Impressive 10-2 Season."




"Talent In First - Place Finishers, But No Back -Ups"
