


(say by about Friday), the effects of Monday Morning Syndrome can be quite devastating, especially with the addition of a first period test or an all period note session.




### Pets








### Construction




### To Drive or Not To Drive








# Gym




# Sophomoric Vegetation








### Two at a Table






### **Previous Lives**




## Spectating






### Homecoming Dance
