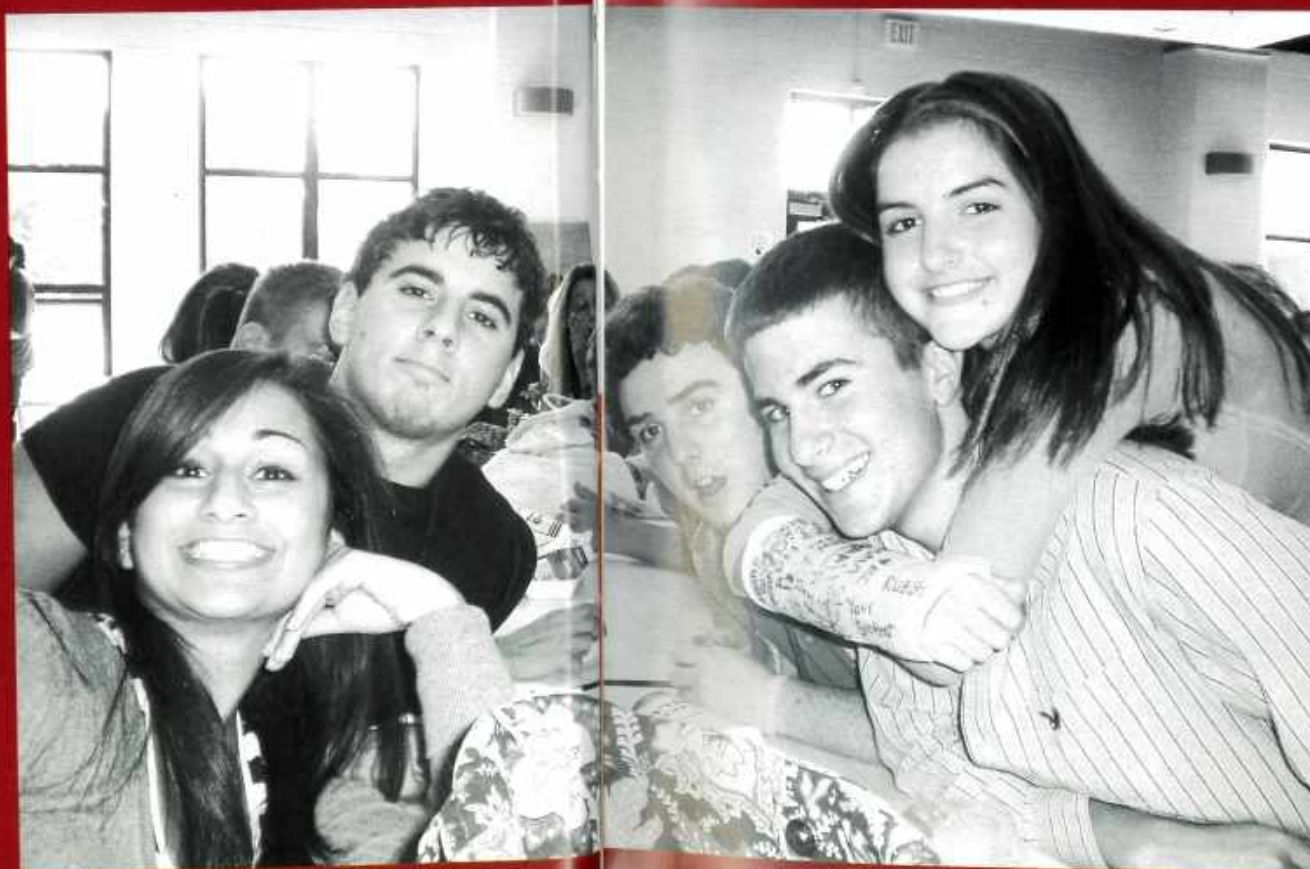

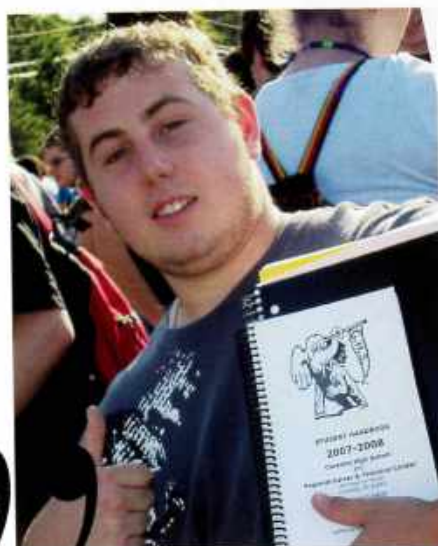

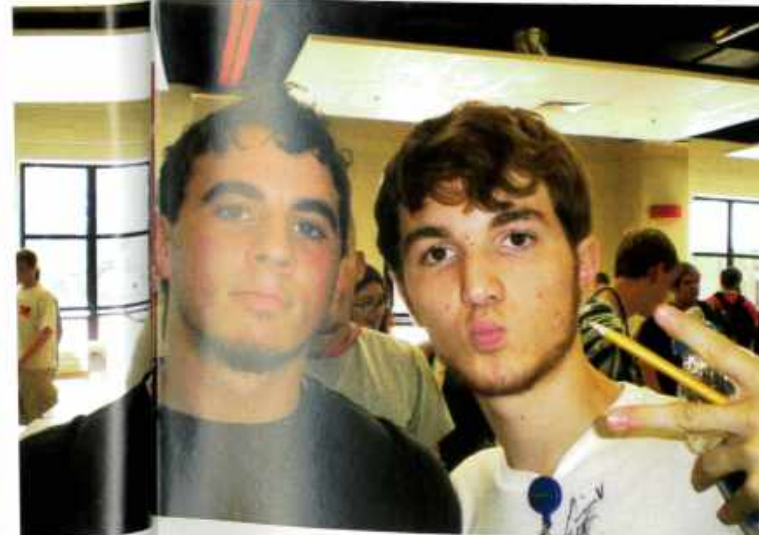

SENIOR HISTORY

On August 30, 2004, the Class of 2008 entered the halls of Coventry High School for the first time. As freshmen we tried to fit in, wondered why we were still on teams, struggled to open our lockers, looked for the pool on the third floor, and endured the first of many welcoming assemblies. Knowing 2008 was a long way away, we yawned about Capstone, PBGR's and portfolios. Our class advisors, Ms. Palumbo and Ms. Carroll, and our Class President Joshua Zeolla, guided us through our first homecoming float construction. The theme of homecoming was children's books, and our float featured "Snoopy and the Peanuts Gang." It failed to impress the judges! Our Junior Prom themed "Masquerade," was magical at Rhodes on the Pawtuxet. Michael Manna and Michaela DiPrete were crowned King and Queen. Matt Addington was named the first Coventry Idol. On Class Day, we bid goodbye to our rivals and our friends, the Class of 2007. We staged a great Class Day skit and turned our class rings to signify that we, the Class of 2008, had finally arrived.

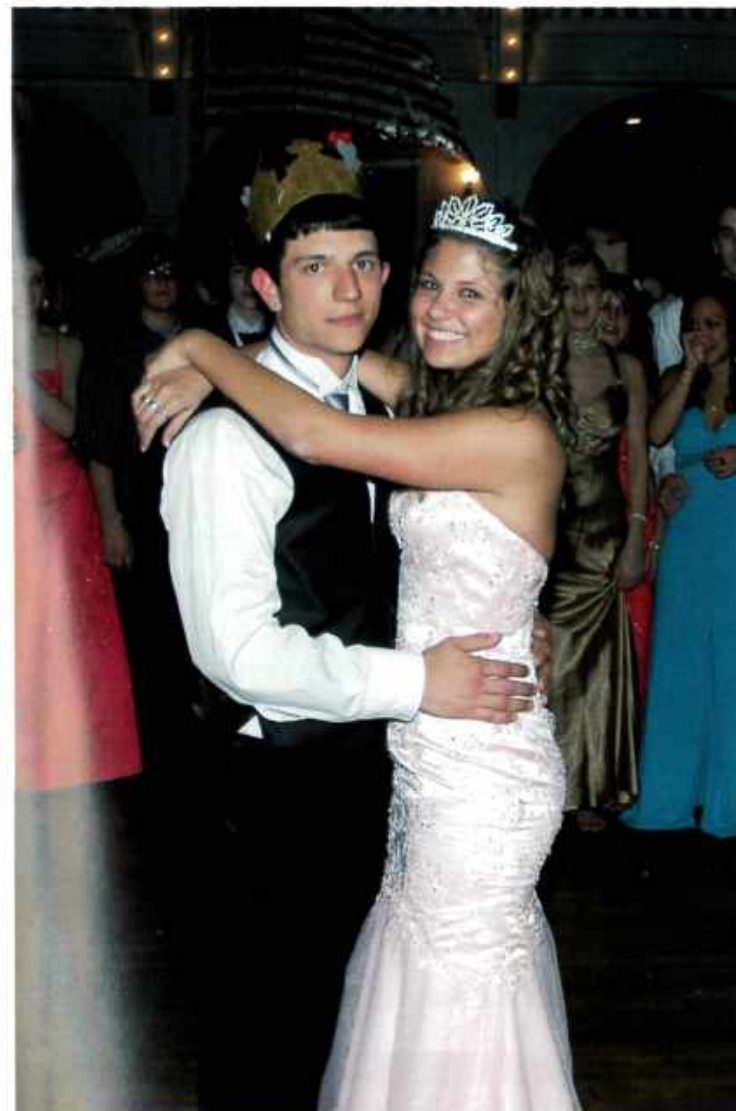
Senior year! Our year, our school. We entered CHS in August 2007...confused. Why did Mr. Hobin change the room numbers?

At the Homecoming game, our football team won, beating Pilgrim with a score of 25-21. Mike Beckman and Shannen Pelletier were crowned Homecoming King and Queen. For the first time, one team won both "The Hunt" and "The Hunt" costume competition. The senior team of Michaela Connelly, Abbie Casavant, Shori DeGraide, and Lindsay Paiva captured both titles dressed as "Masterpieces." In November, we ordered our caps and gowns and wore our class t-shirts, designed by Jonny Ruzzo. Sarah Rubstein and Jonny Ruzzo also began working on our class mural.

We stopped yawning about Capstone, PBGR's and portfolios. We needed to complete them in order to cross the stage at the Ryan Center. In December, we organized "Breakfast with Santa" and planned the Winter Ball. At Winter Ball in January 2008, we got to dance on the speakers, and our presence was announced when the DJ asked, "Are there any seniors in the house?" Our last Spirit Week came and went. (To see if we "d0min8ted" see the Spirit Week section.) We attended the Senior Ball at Crowne Plaza on May 9th. It was here we realized that our time at CHS was drawing to a close. We shed our first tears as we realized what great friends we had made and what difficulties we had overcome. But most importantly, we began to realize that many of us would be going our separate ways after graduation.

At Senior Supper at Quidnesset Country Club, we received our caps and gowns, Senior Ball pictures, and yearbook, whose theme was appropriately titled "The Making of a Classic." 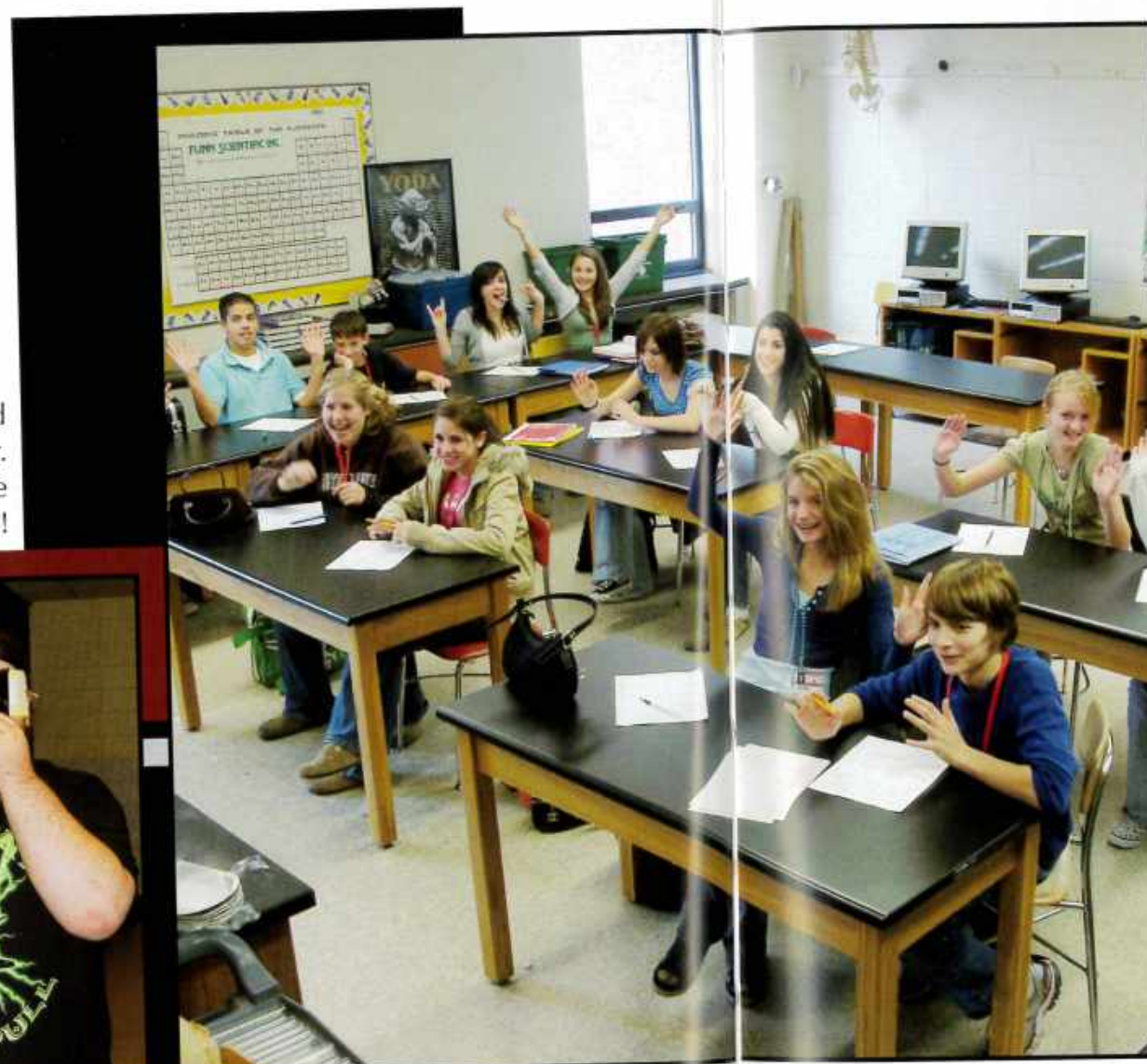

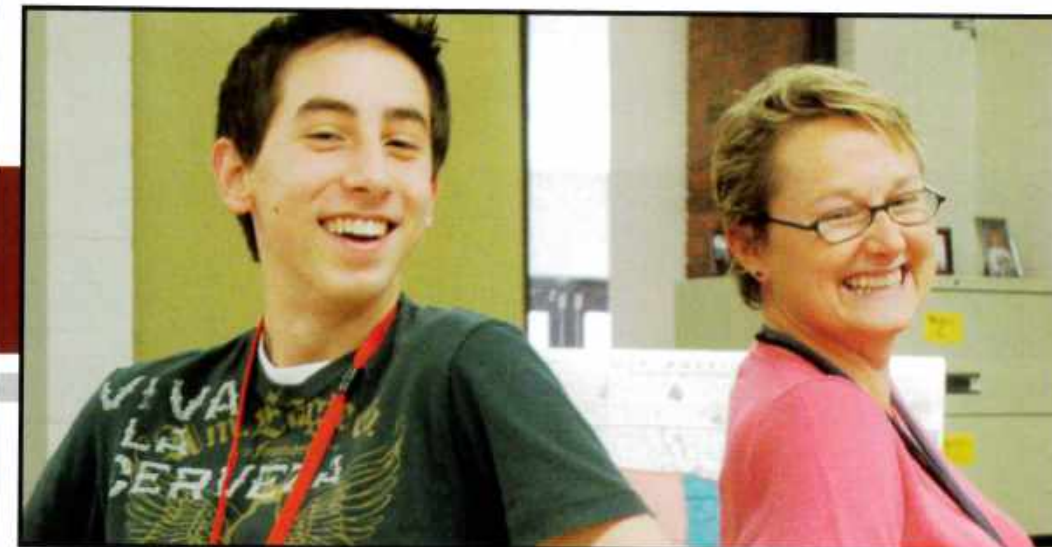

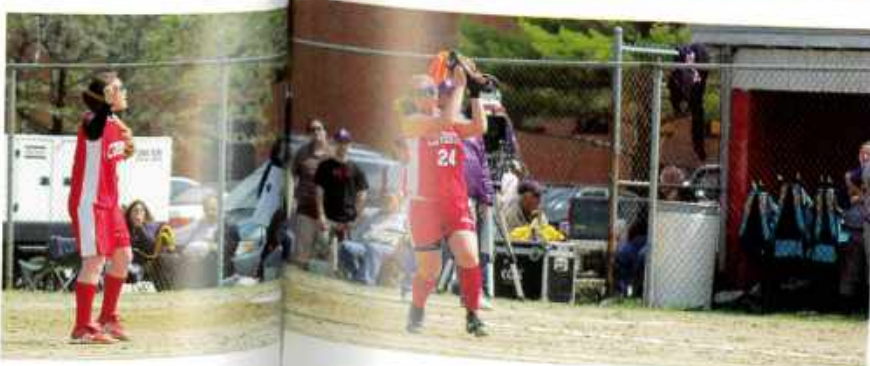

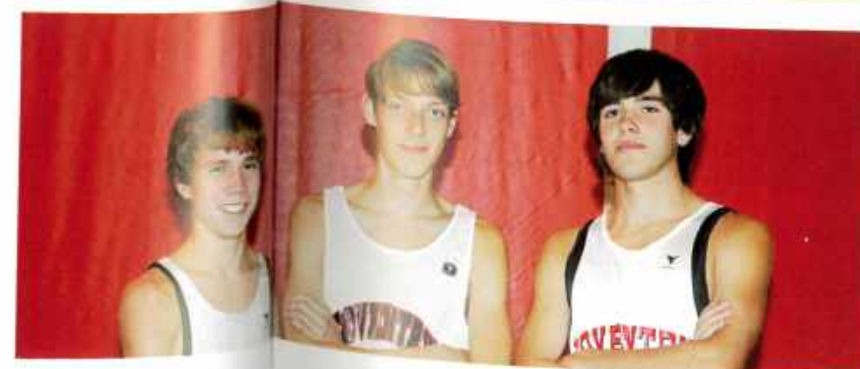

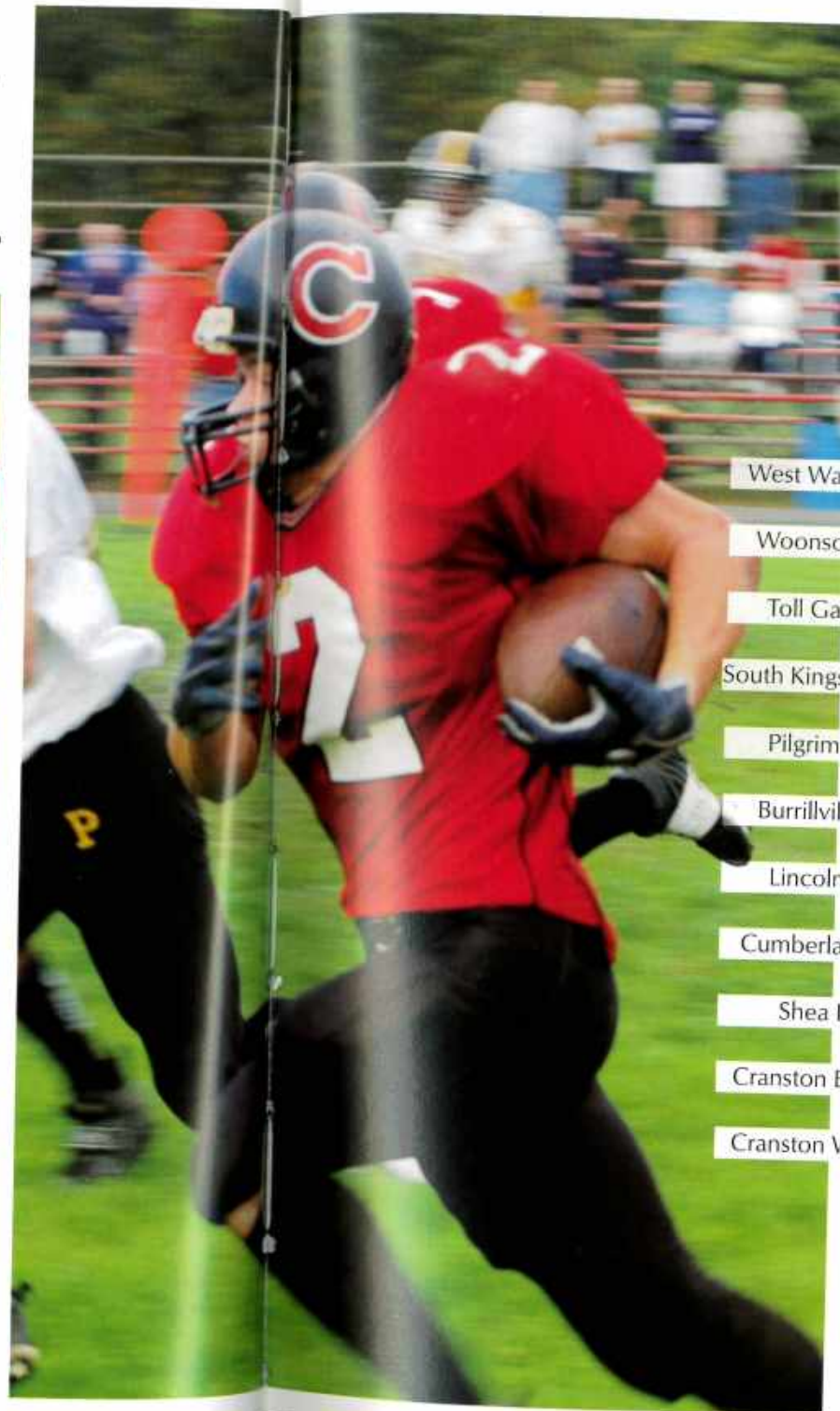

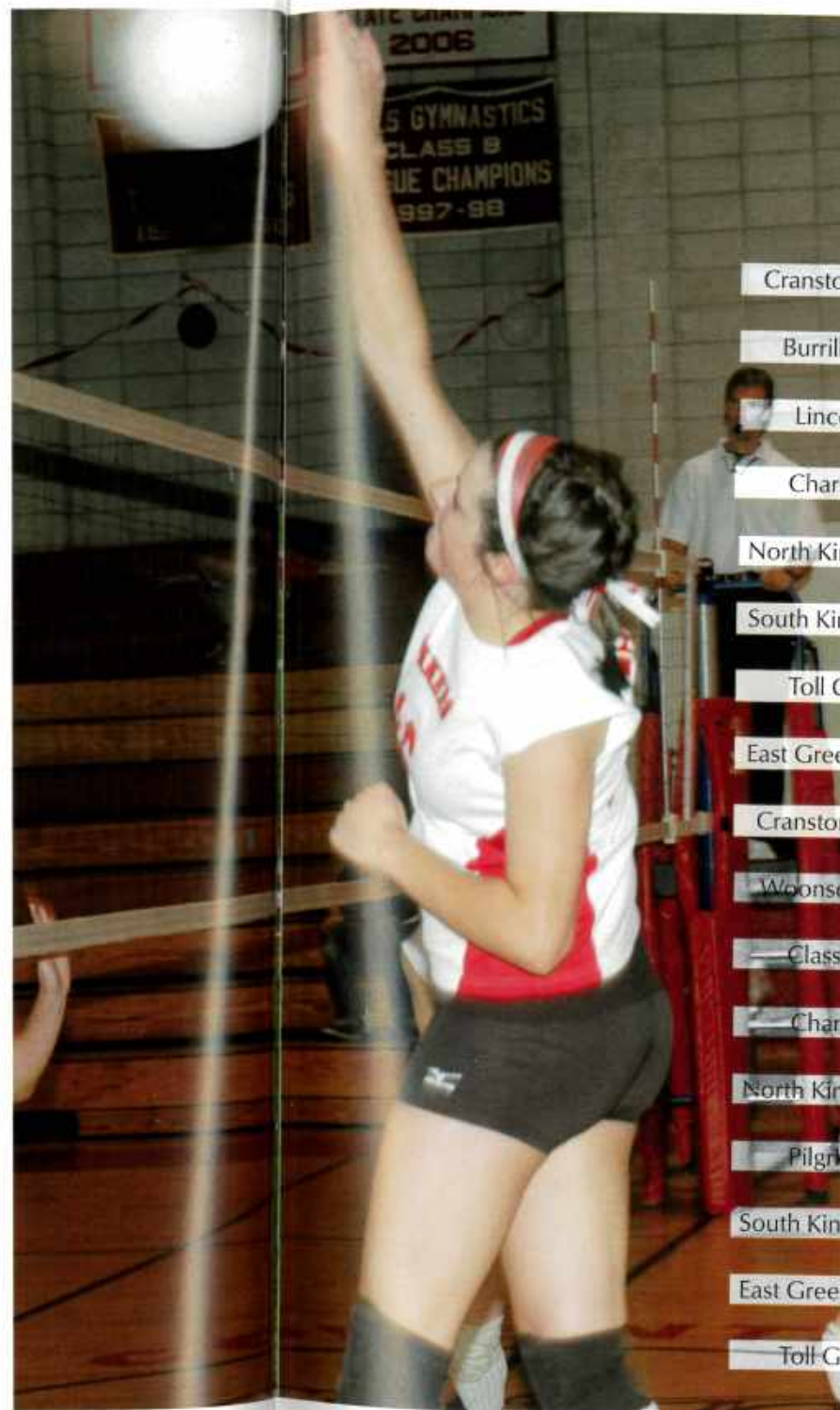

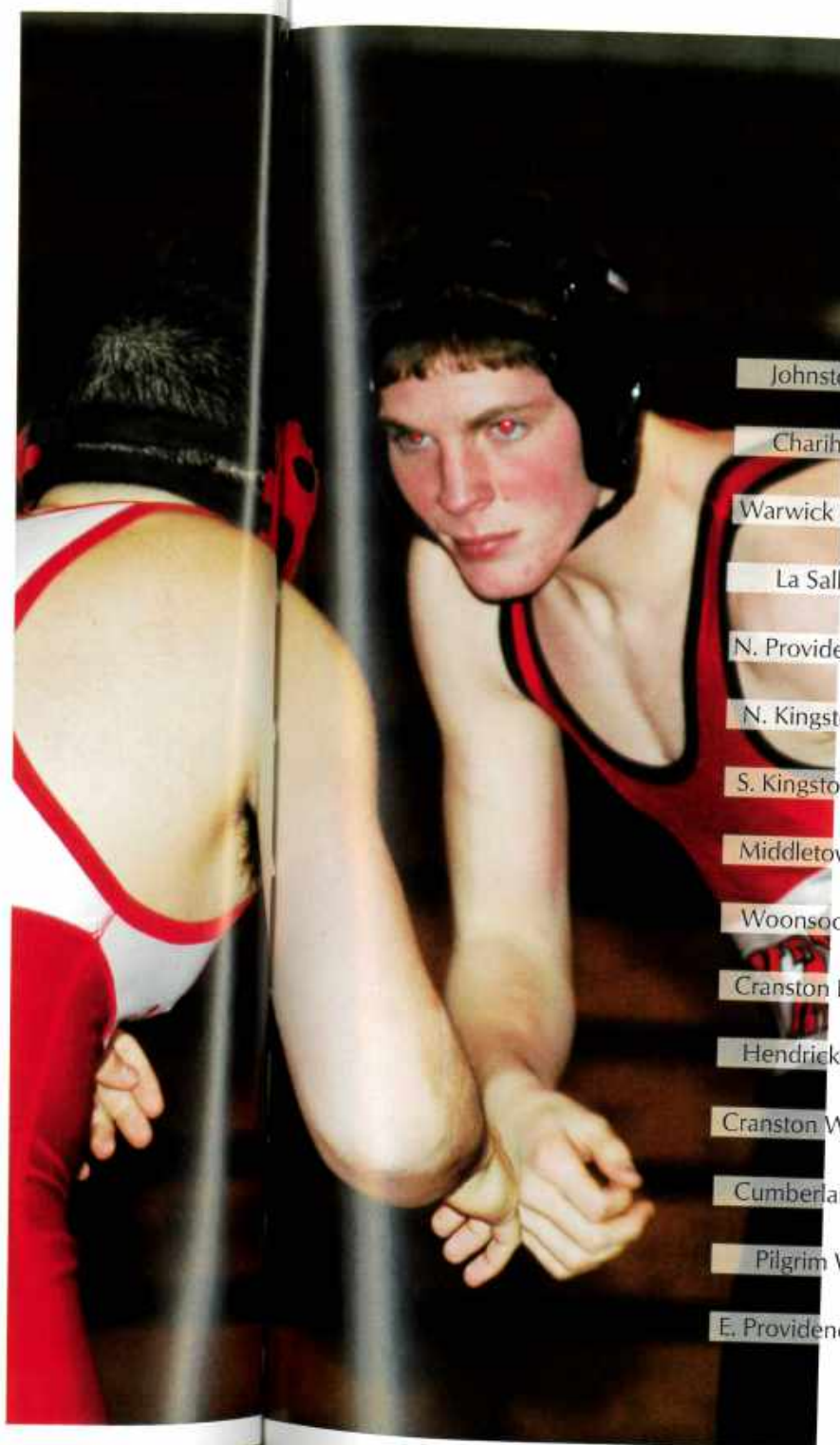

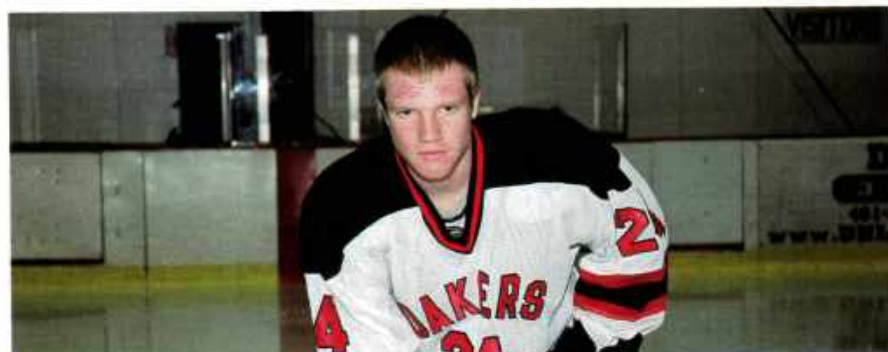

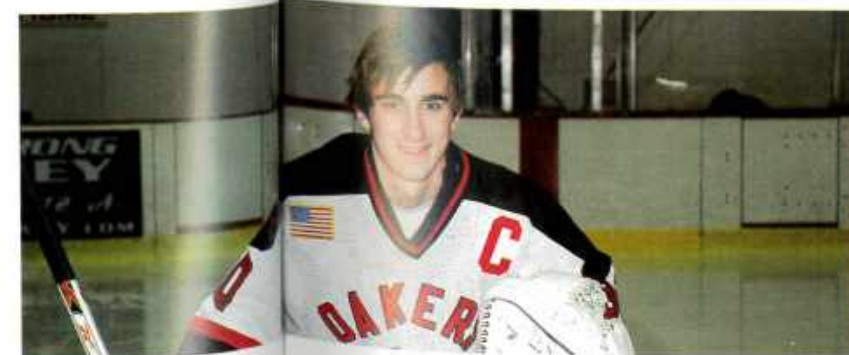

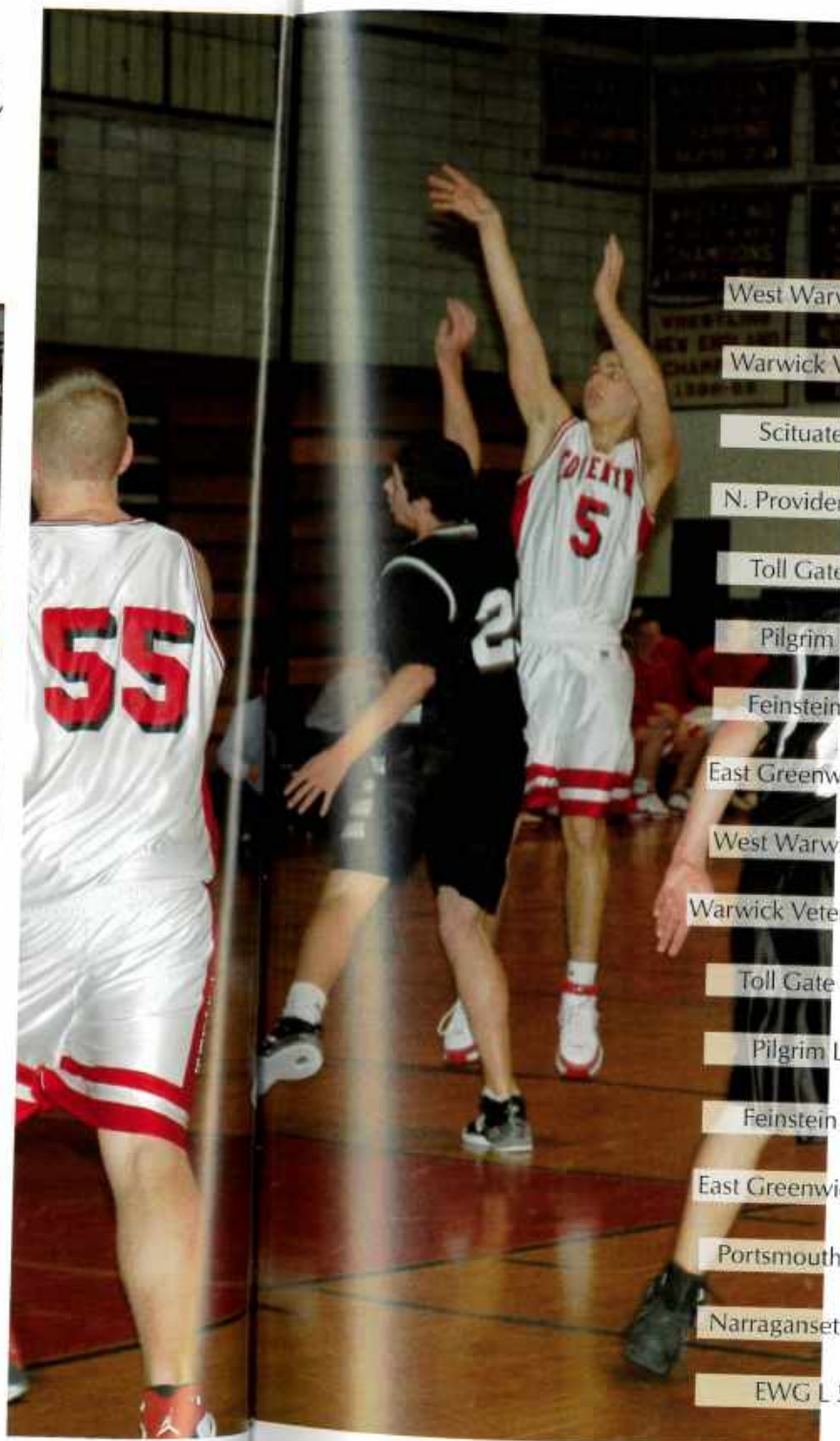

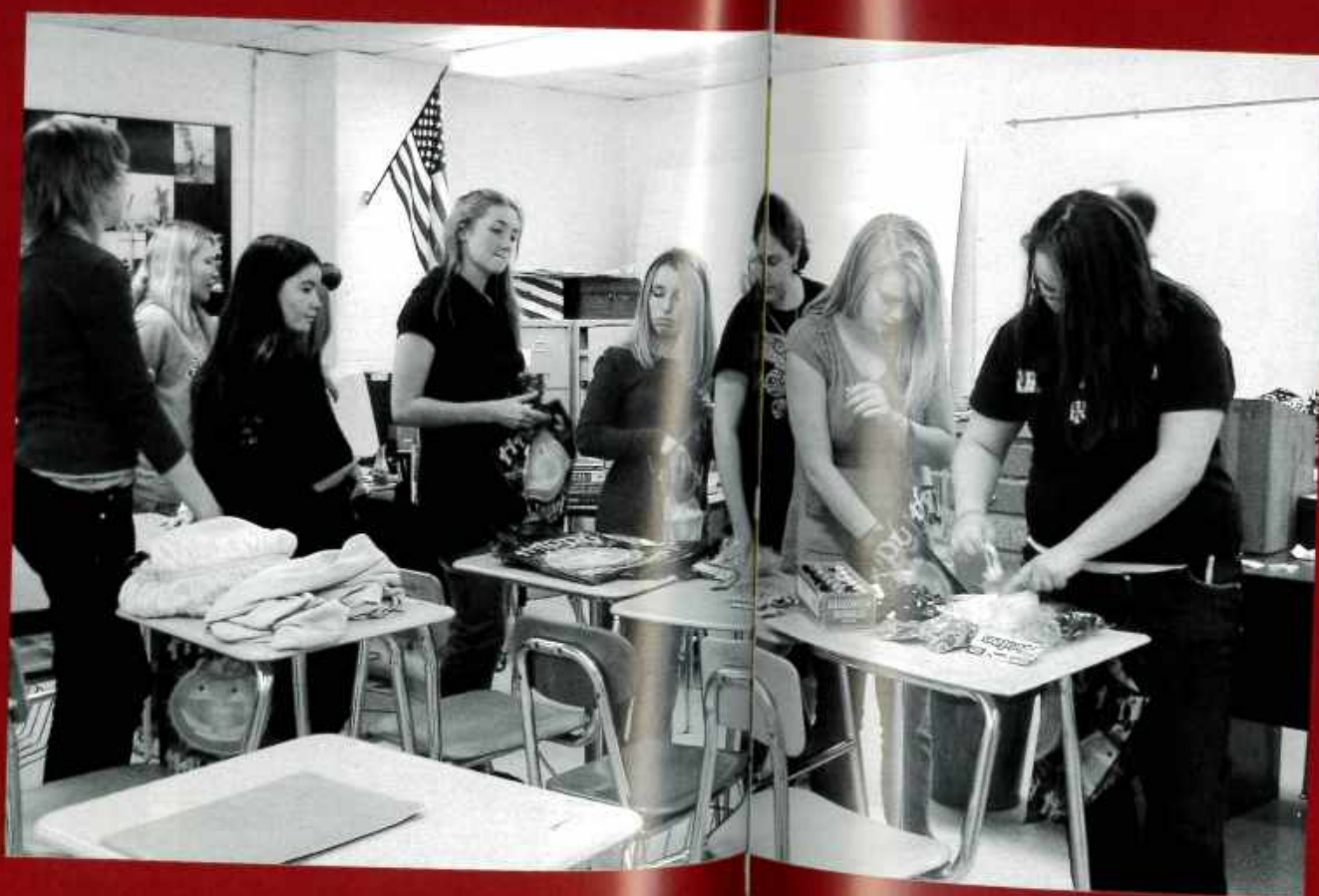

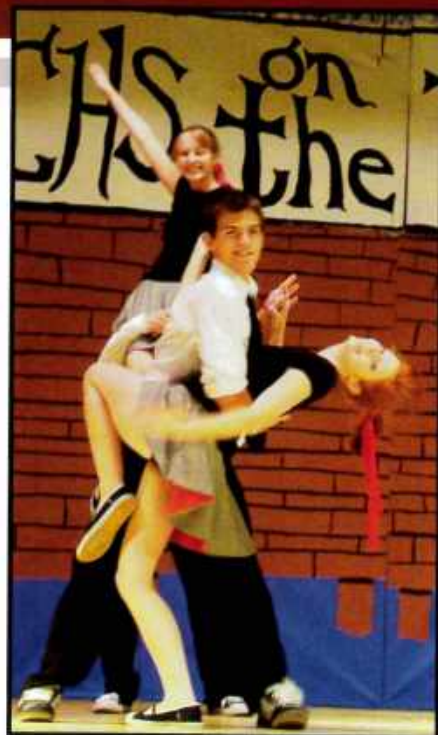

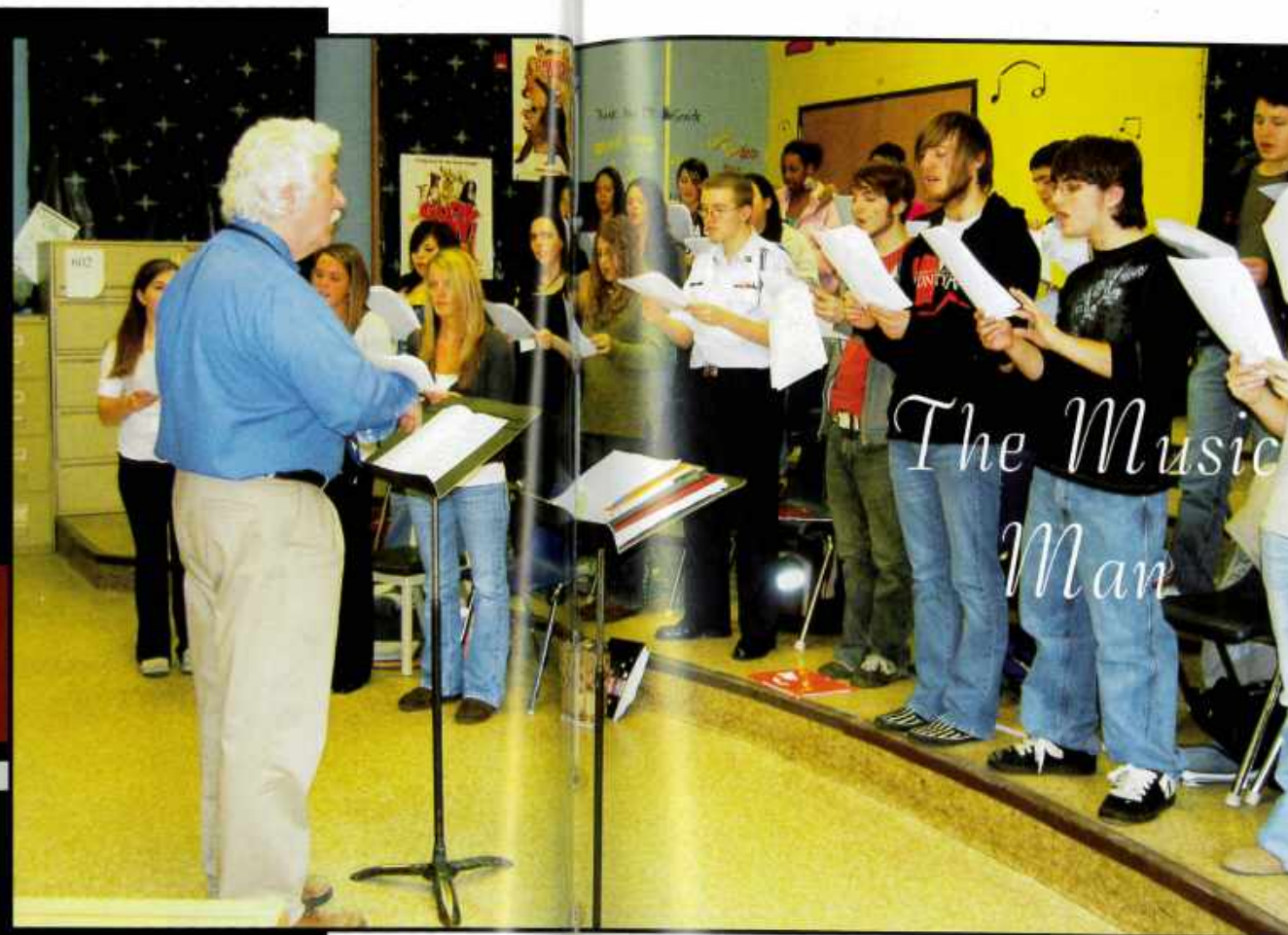


SCIENCE CLUB

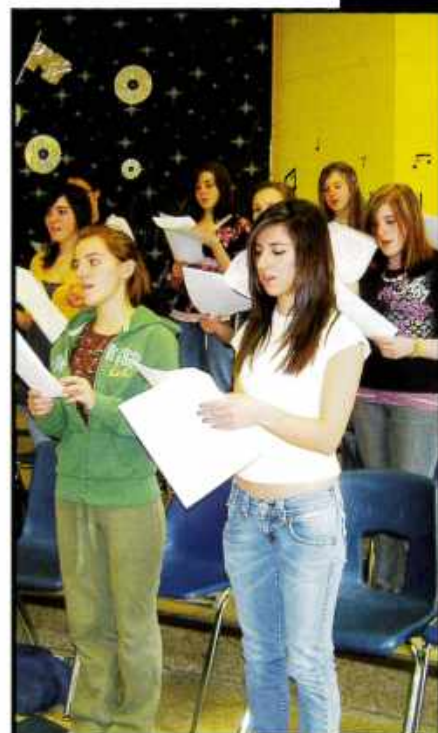


MARCHING BAND

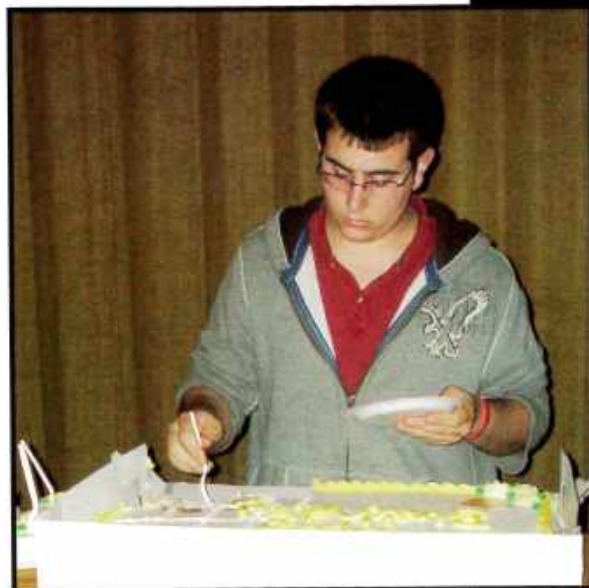

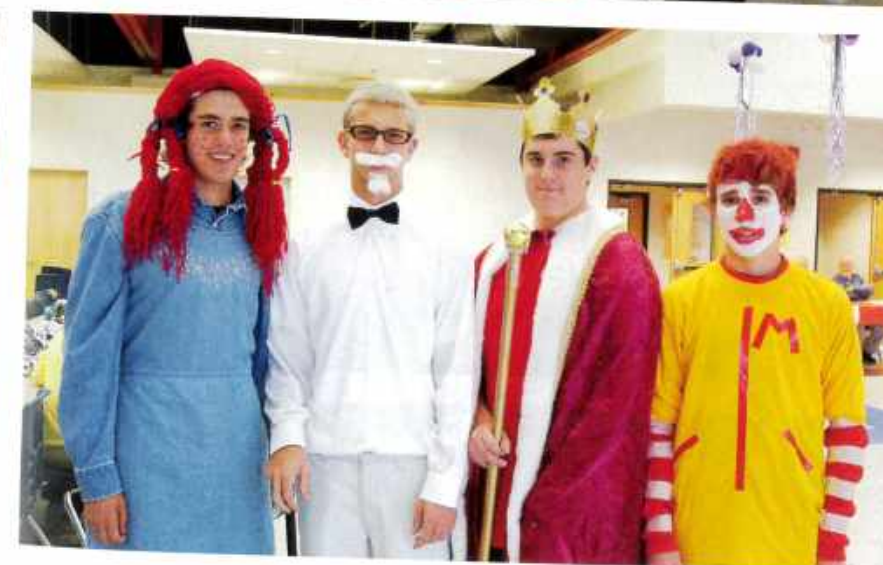

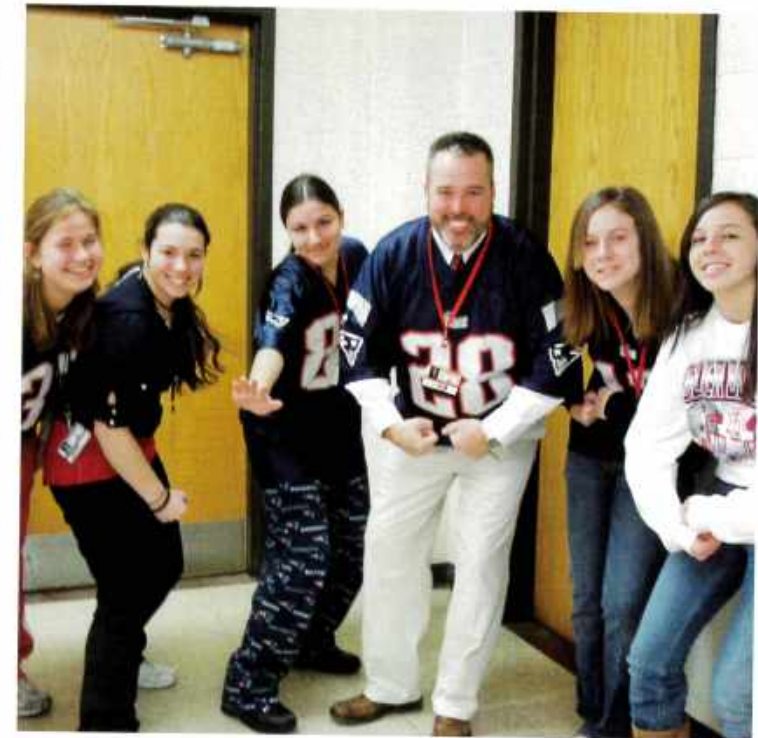
