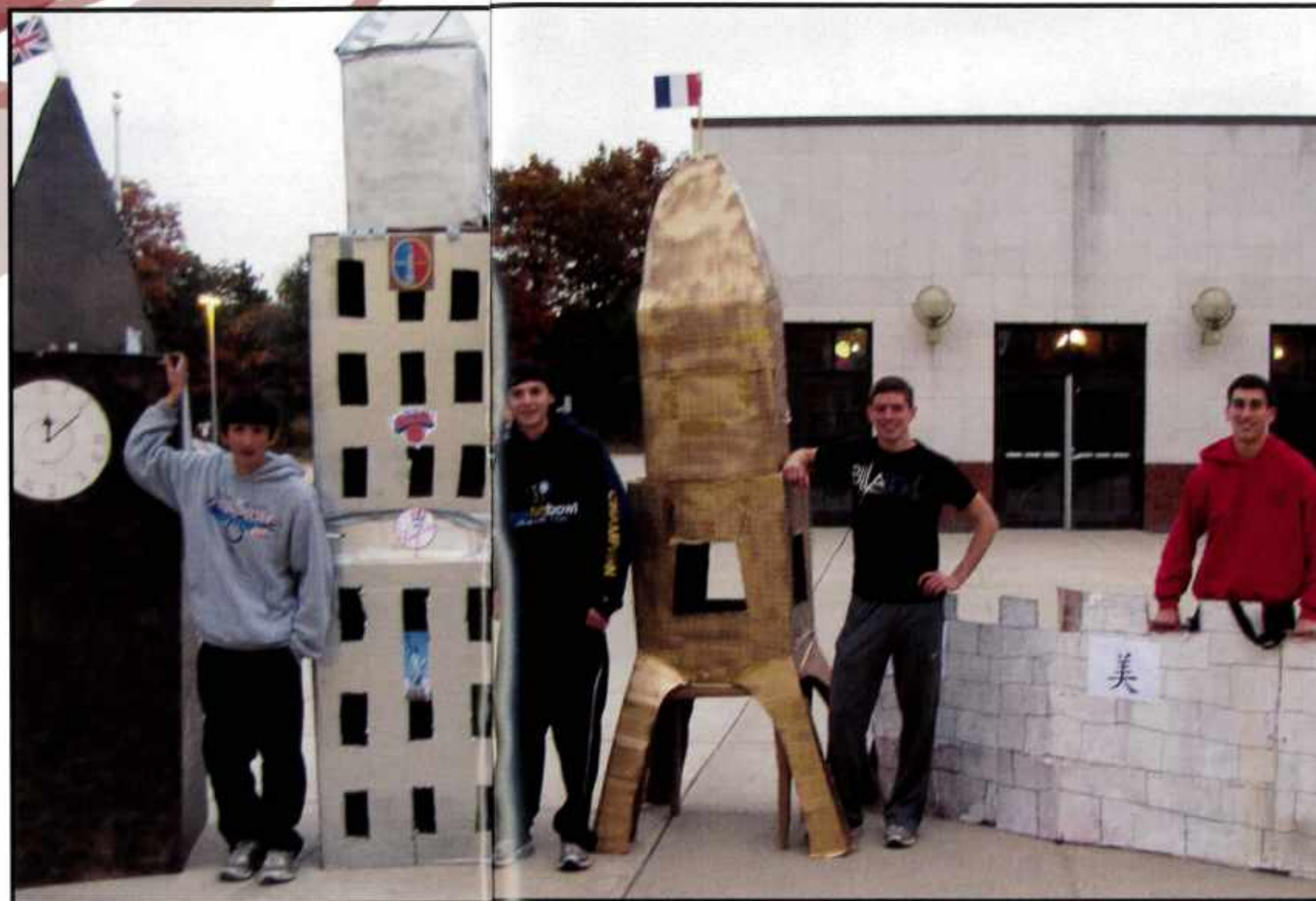

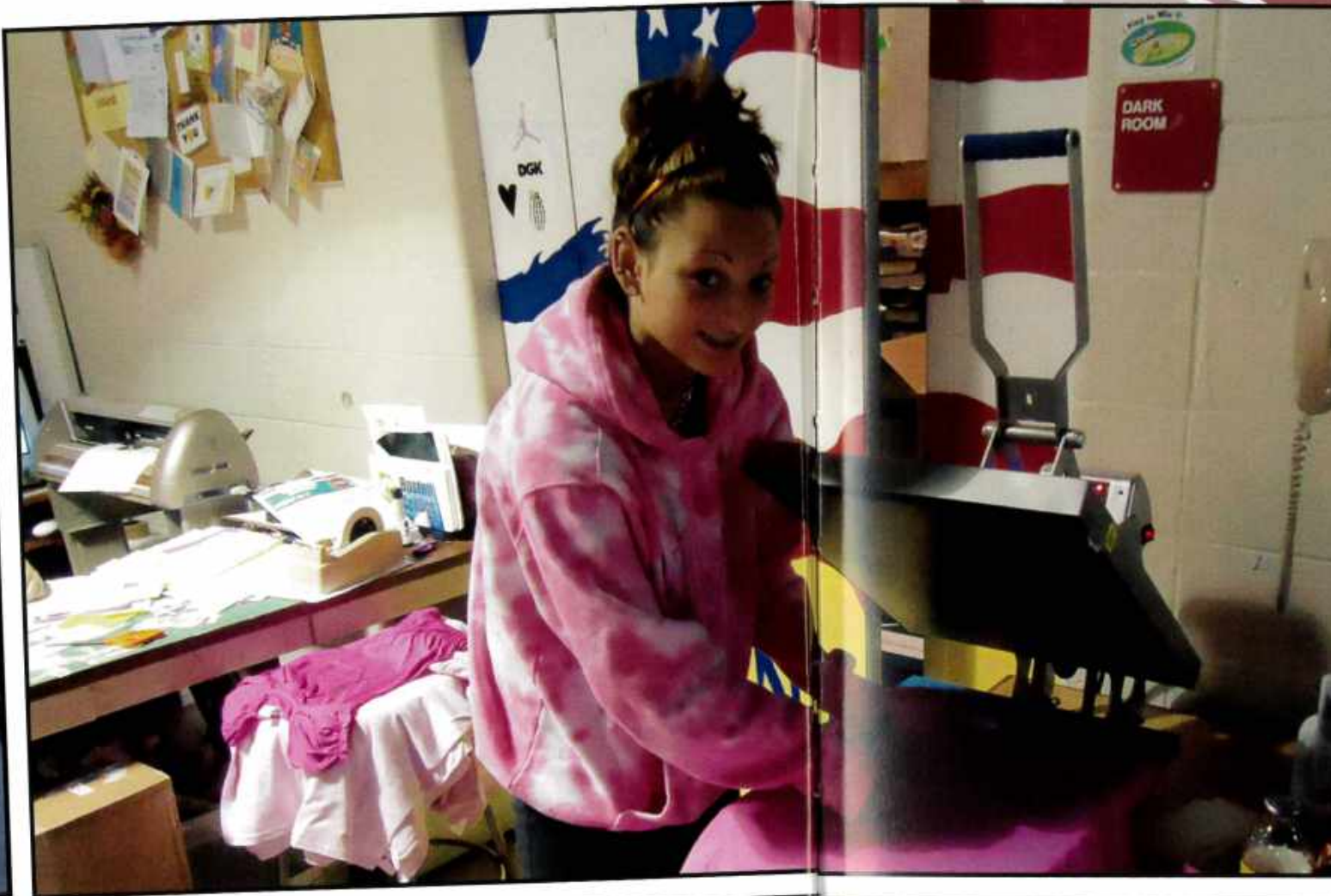

Fight Pink

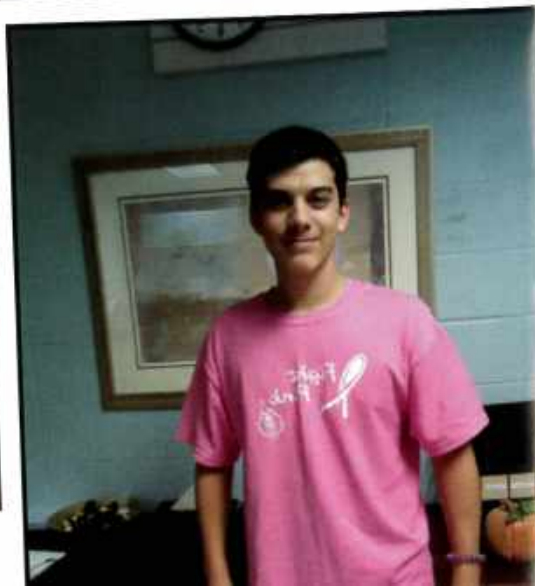

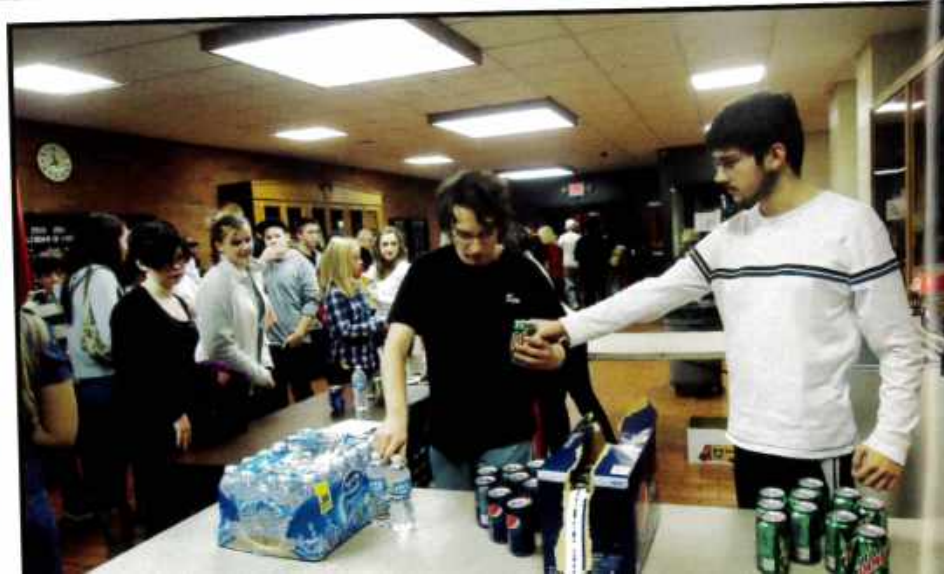


Varsity Revue

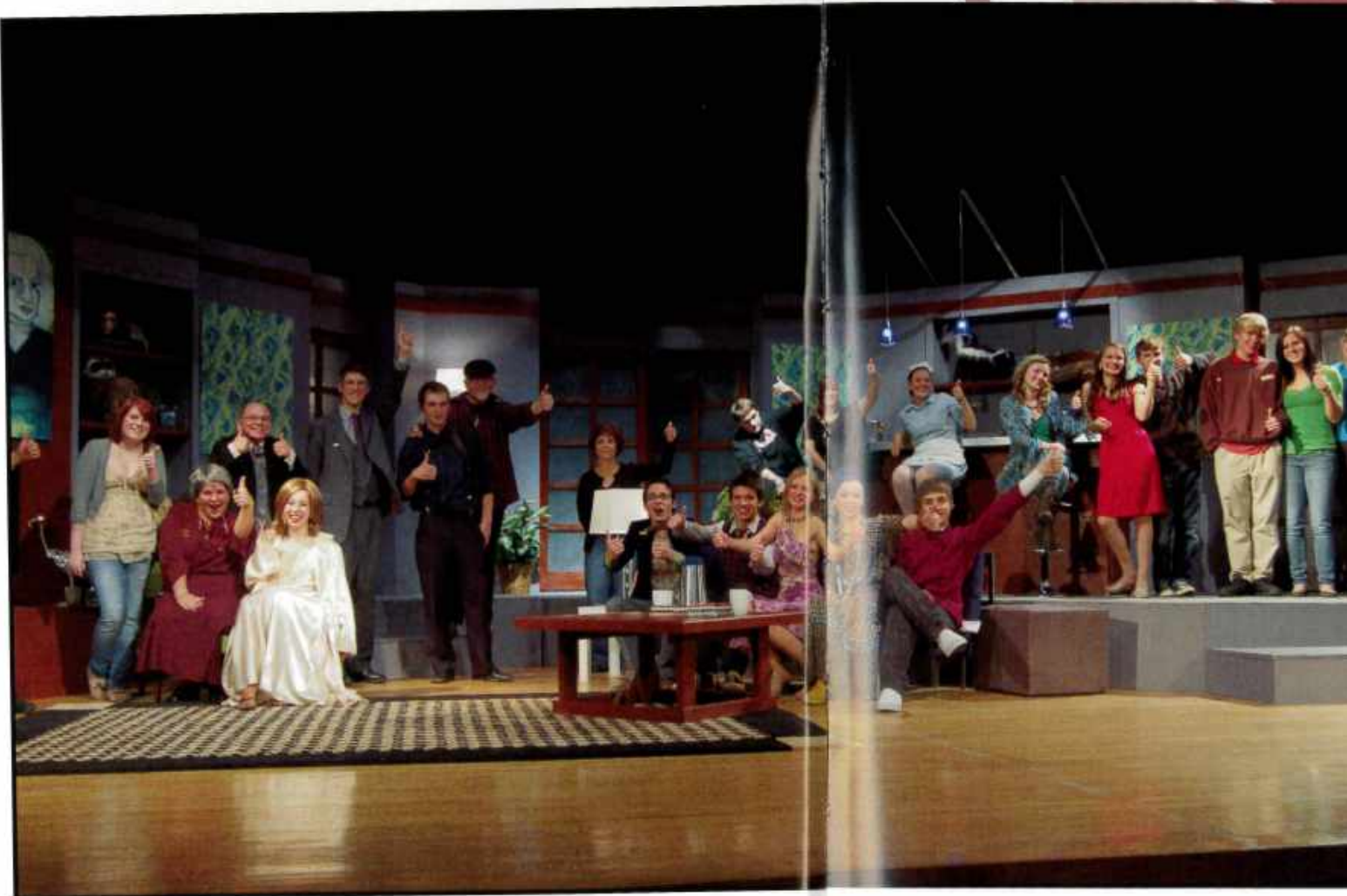
Powder Puff

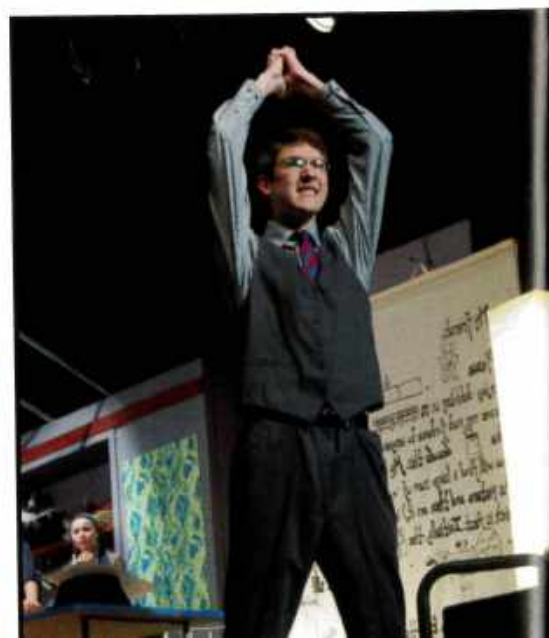


Fall Play

Community Night

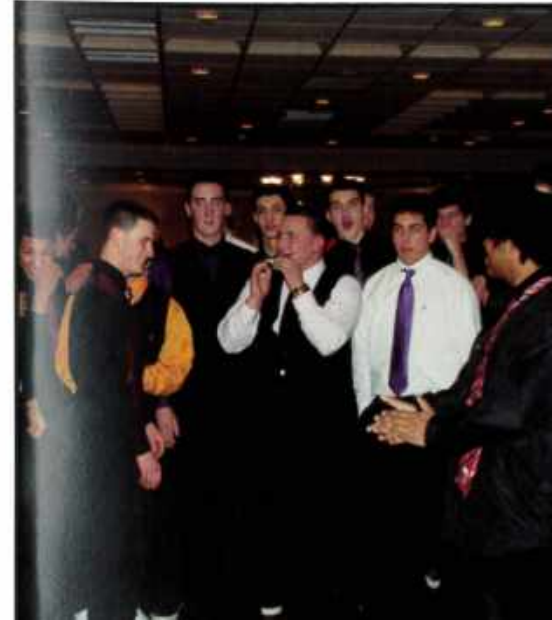
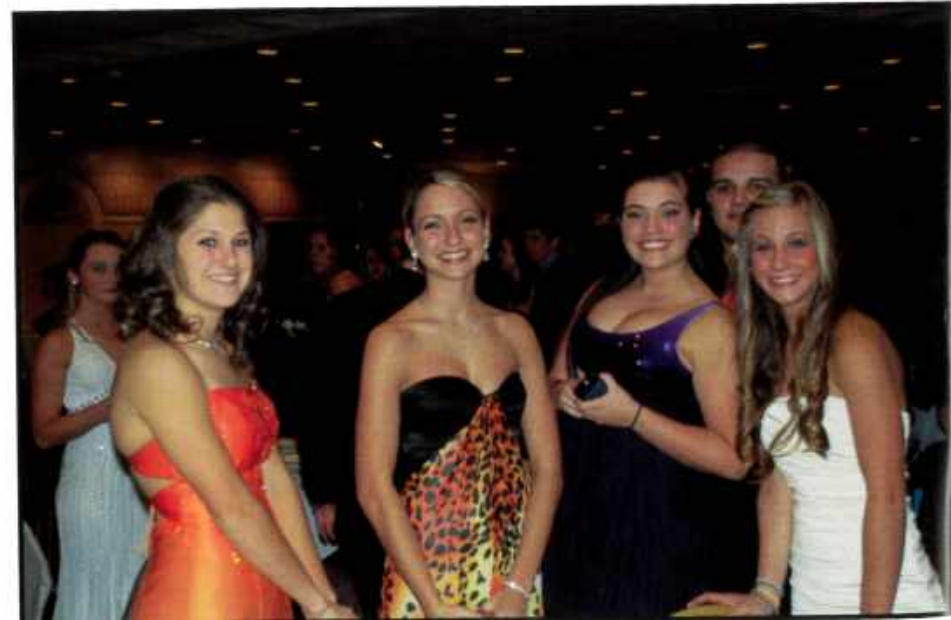

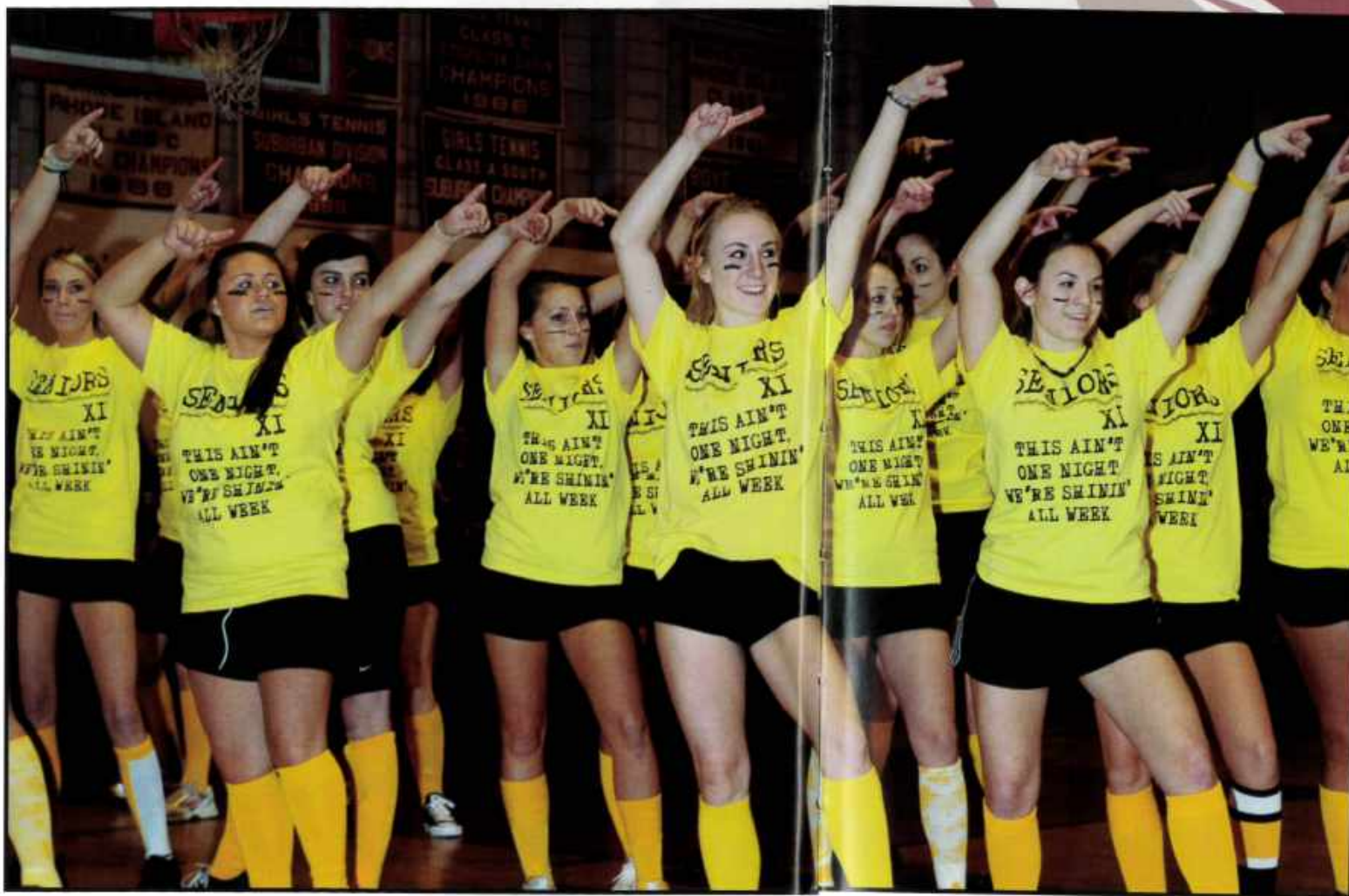

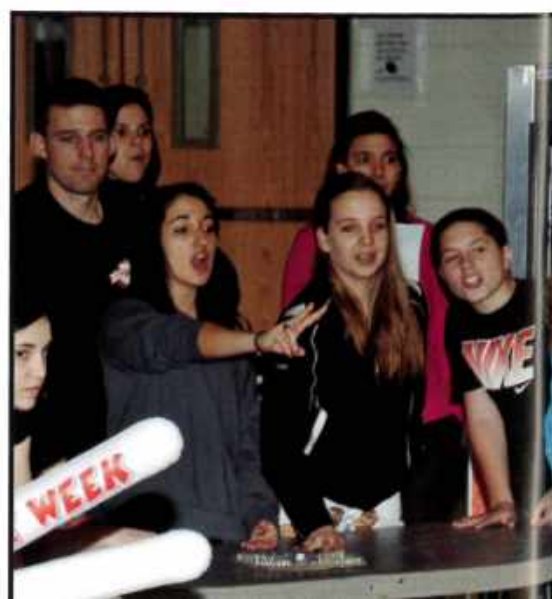
Spirit Week

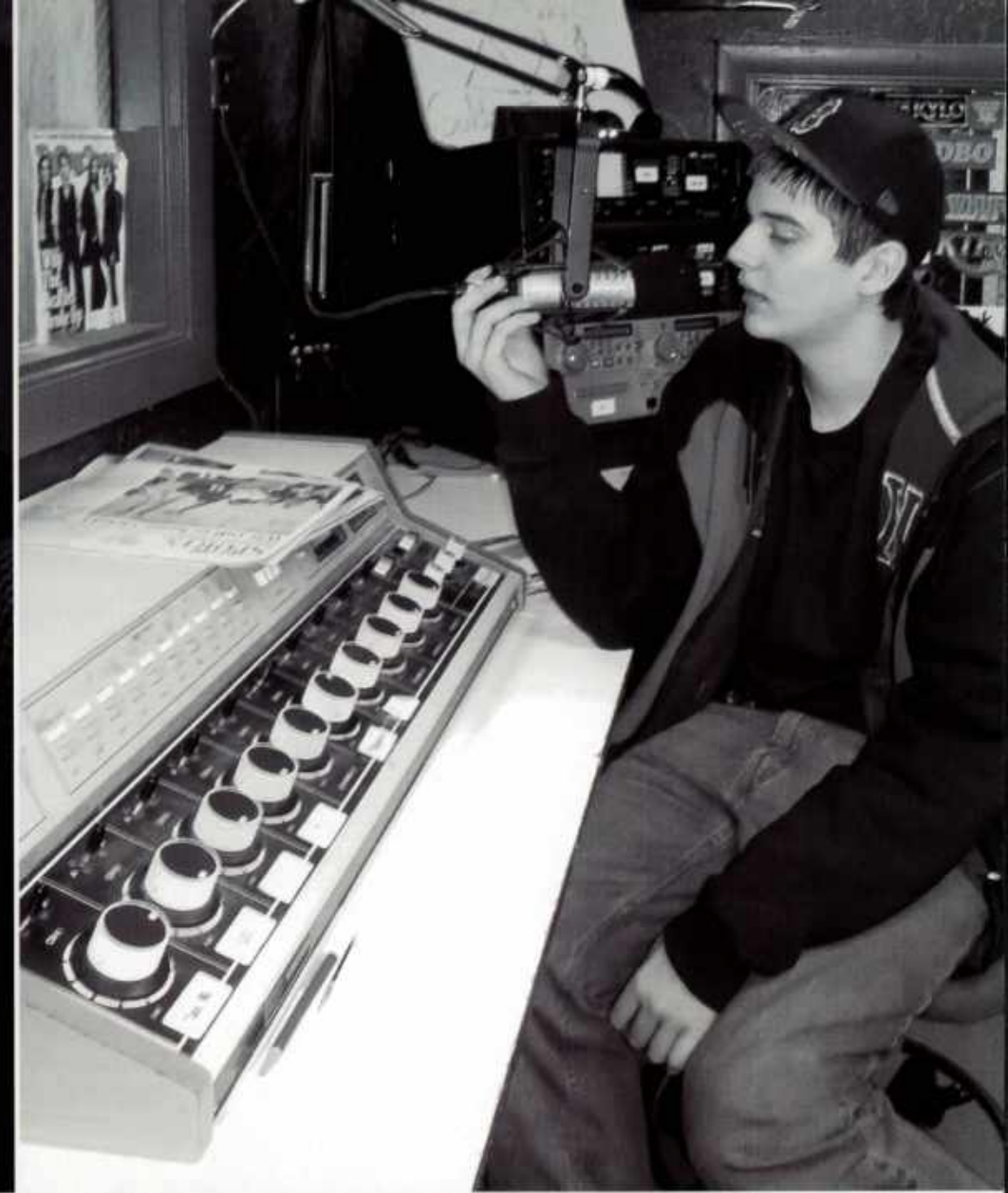

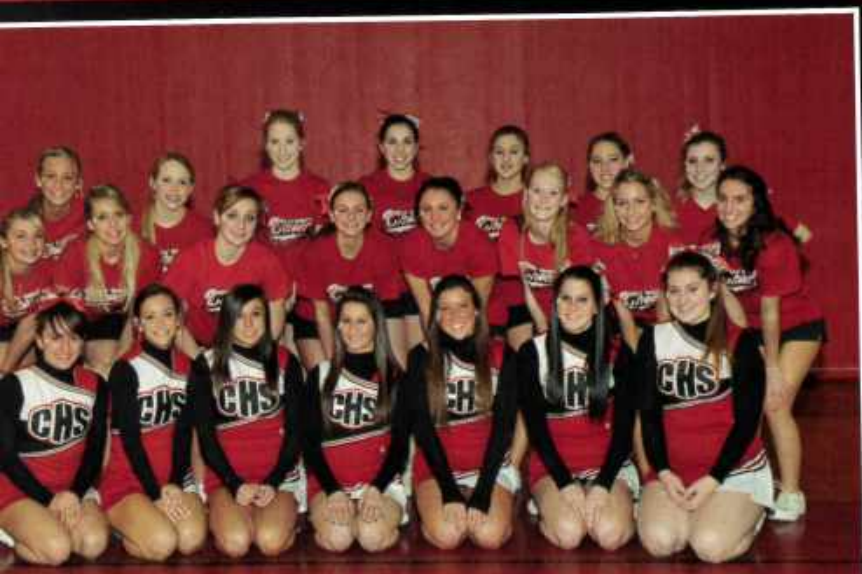

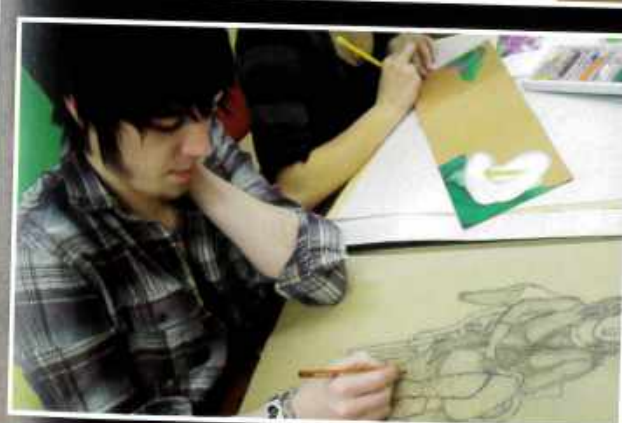

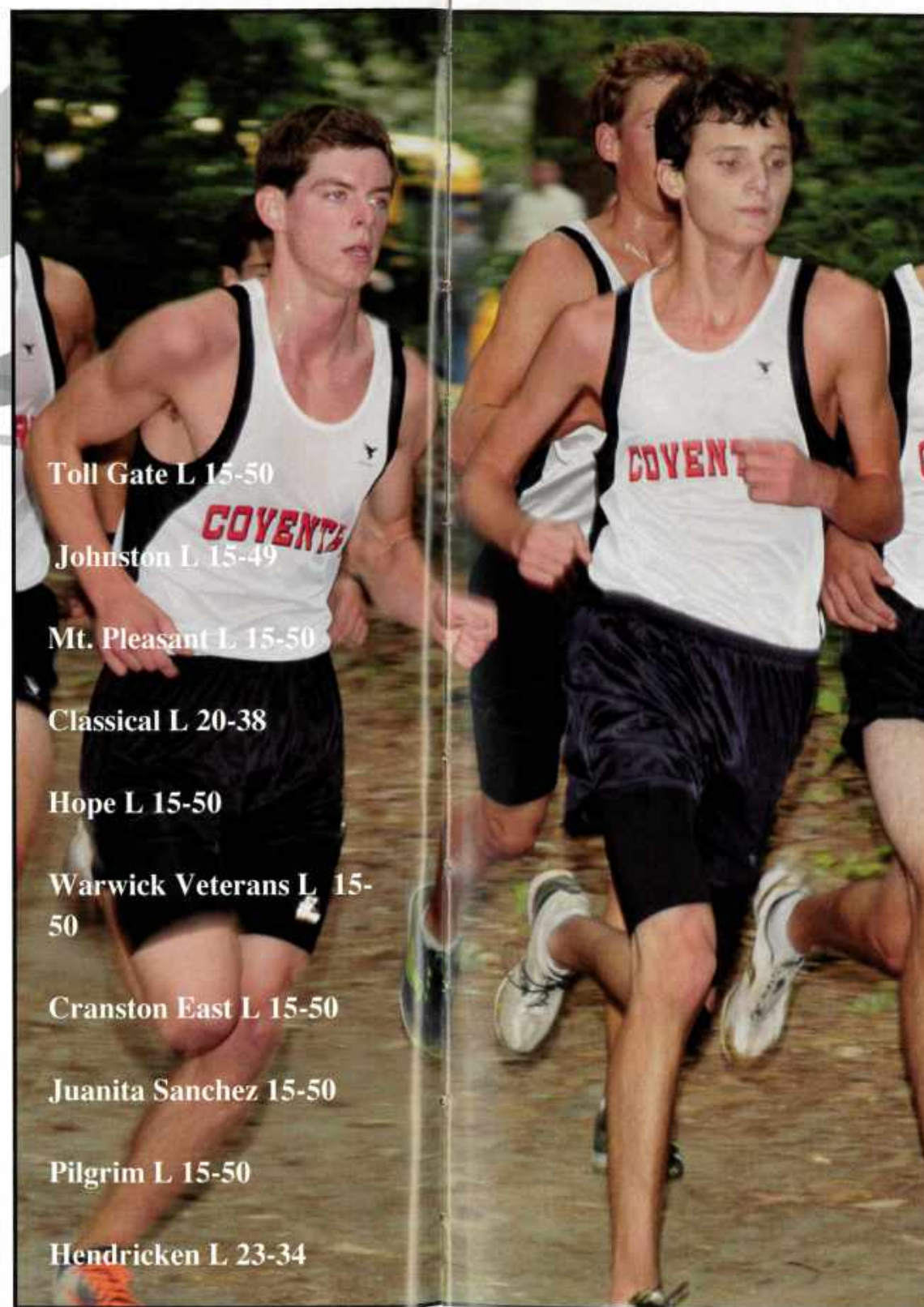

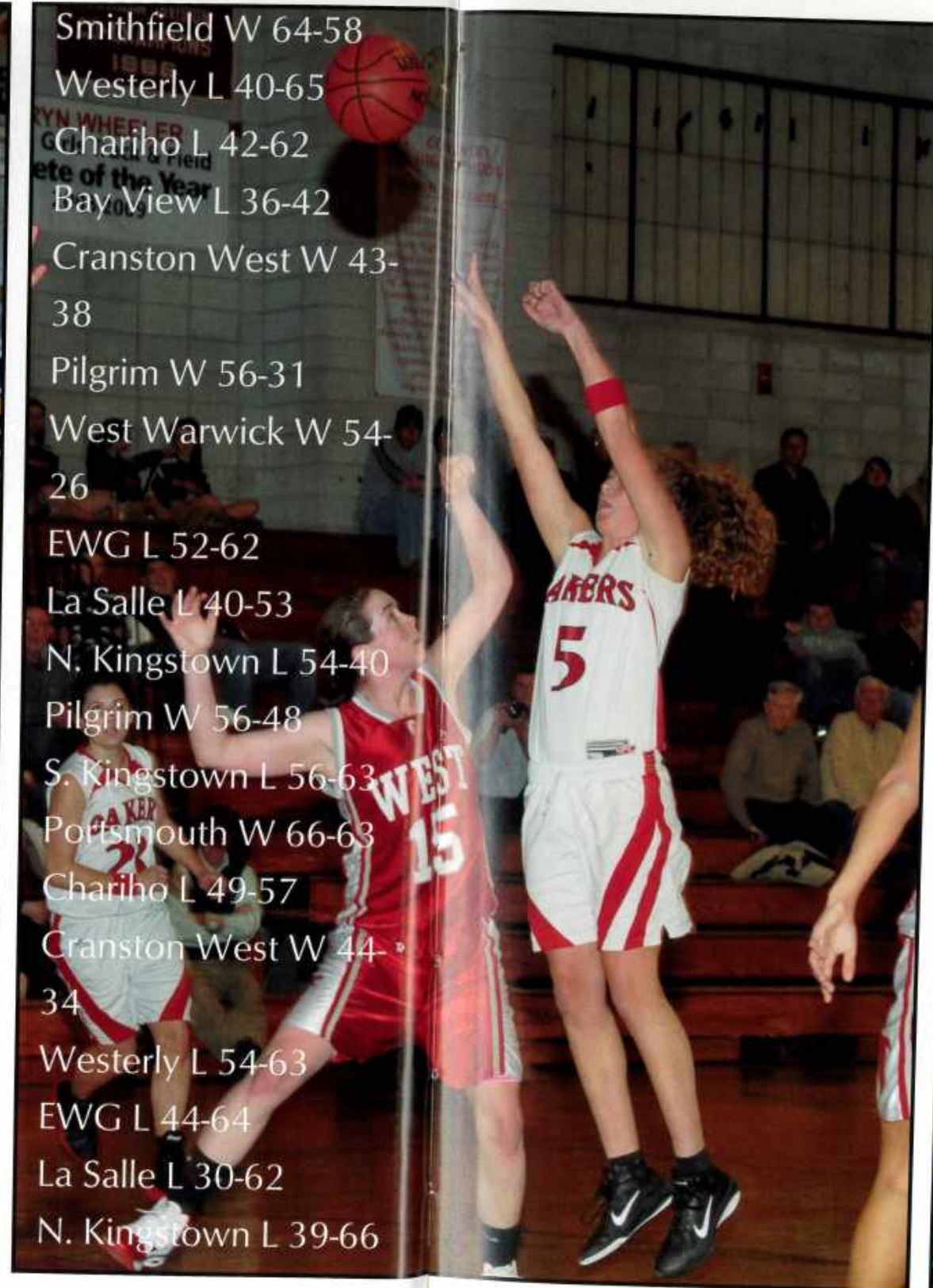

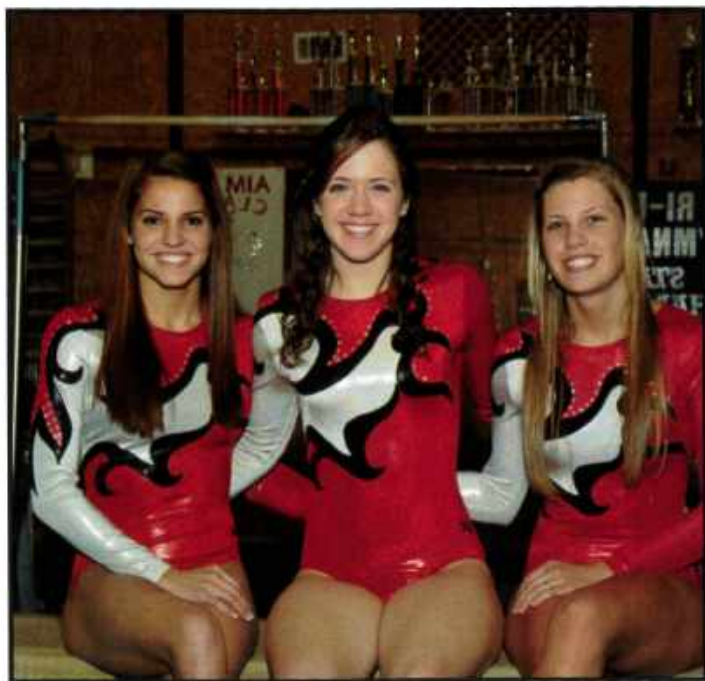
